Whereas, many of our local small businesses are certified Age-Smart Employers, that embrace agediversity and create workplaces that value equity, inclusiveness, and intergenerational respect; and

Multnomah County, its Economic Development and Work Committee, and our champions for local small businesses, including Venture Portland and Elders in Action; and

Whereas, today we presented the inaugural Age-Friendly Business Awards to 11 Portland businesses that provide quality employment opportunities and innovative services to our older adults; and

Whereas, the City of Portland and Multnomah County share a vision of a city that welcomes and celebrates people of all ages and abilities;
