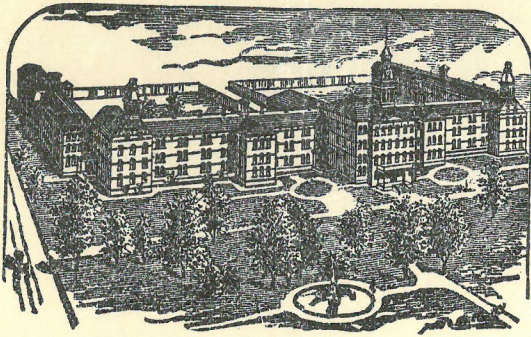

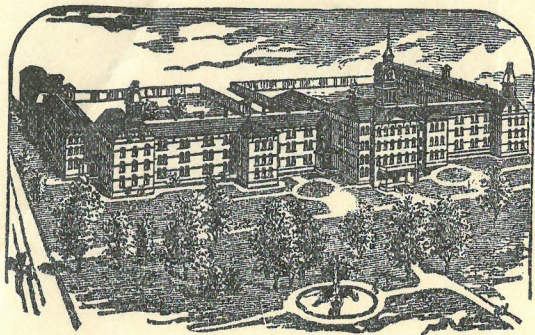

Dear Sir

Acting upon a thought called to my attention by your little contraversion with some of your officials in reference to the payment of the city's bills. I take this opportunity of sending you a requisition sheet and duplicate sheet cut from our regular requisition book and filled out for the occasion that you may be able to show them how we do this business.

You will note by observing the requisition that all of the items were asked for on Aug. 4<sup>th</sup> that the same were allowed by the Superintendent on Aug. 5<sup>th</sup> that the lime, cement and sand was received and billed on Aug 8<sup>th</sup> see column of "Date purchased" that the fire bricks were received and billed Aug 12<sup>th</sup>.

that the large gear was received and billed Aug 11<sup>th</sup> we do not fill in this date until the goods and bill are received and then make this date to correspond with date of bill.

You will note the two check marks in the "Articles" column the black ✓ denotes that the Engineer has received the goods and the red ✓ denotes that the Book keeper has audited the account and drawn a voucher for the same.

In reference to the ③ after Portland Iron Works, in explanation will say that the Steward of the Asylum is the purchasing agent for The Asylum and not thoroughly understanding what was wanted in reference to the large gear he instructed the Engineer Strang to purchase this item and therefore the Engineer makes this ③ sign to show that he was the party who made the purchase. The original or perforated sheet is torn from the book and filed with the Sept.



The duplicate sheet remains in the book and is used for reference at all times.

You will note at the bottom of the sheet that the Engineer signs as having received the goods in good order on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of Aug. 1905. Will make the plans and specifications for the Septic Tank at my first opportunity, with kind regards I remain
