

ORDINANCE NO. 189282

* Authorize application to accept and appropriate three traffic enforcement grants for a total of \$90,000 for FY 2018-19 from Oregon Impact for sworn overtime reimbursement (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Police Bureau wishes to apply for and accept three traffic enforcement grants;
2. Oregon Impact has notified the City it will award \$50,000 for reimbursement of Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants High Visibility Enforcement (DUI HVE) Grant Program activities;
3. Oregon Impact has notified the City it will award \$20,000 for reimbursement of Distracted Driving Enforcement Campaign (DDEC) Grant Program activities;
4. Oregon Impact has notified the City it will award \$20,000 for reimbursement of Pedestrian Safety Enforcement (PSE) Grant Program activities;
5. Oregon Impact will reimburse the City the actual officer overtime rate of pay per hour for the Traffic Division's direct enforcement of reducing impaired driving and improving traffic and pedestrian safety;
6. Oregon Impact requires that agencies receiving DUI HVE funds participate in two National Highway Traffic Safety Administration pre-determined HVE national events with Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police and the Oregon State Police: Christmas 2018/New Year 2019 and Labor Day 2019;
7. Oregon Impact requires agencies receiving DDEC funds to focus enforcement during the month of April 2019 in coordination with National Distracted Driving Awareness Month;
8. Oregon Impact requires that agencies receiving PSE funds will ensure a current and active officer has attended the PSE training course within the past three years of working grant activities;
9. Local match is required in the amount of 50 percent of the amount awarded. The local match may include any agency resources used to support the overtime activity, including scheduling and report compilation, as well as straight-time enforcement. Local match shall be provided from City funds in the form of Traffic Division straight time hours in the Police Bureau's existing General Fund appropriation;

10. The grant period runs through September 30, 2019; and

11. The Council declares that an emergency exists due to critical dates in the project timeline as required by the grants.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Chief of Police, or their designate, is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City three grants from Oregon Impact for FY 2019 DUII HVE, DDEC, and PSE grant programs in the amount of \$90,000 and to execute the grant agreements.
- b. The Chief of Police is authorized to provide such information and assurances as are required for the grant period.
- c. The FY 2018-19 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Fund - 217

Business Area - PL

Bureau Program Expenses - \$90,000

- d. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant applications, grant agreements or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Chief and Mayor's behalves.
- e. The Chief of the Police, or their designate, is authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent grant program modifications by Oregon Impact provided such modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists due to critical dates in the project timeline as required by the grants. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


