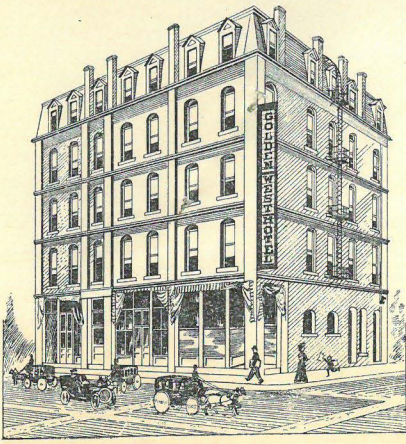

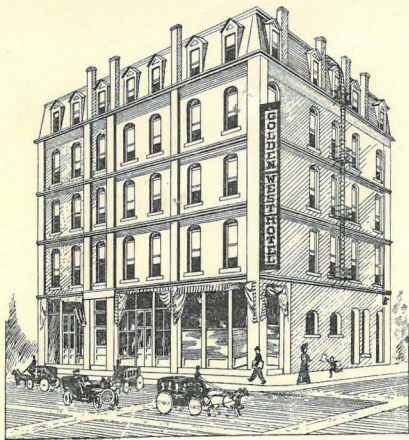
Resolutions.
