Attached hereto please find report of Officer Inskeep on the owners and lessees of the Chinese gambling houses in the new building on 4th Street between Everett & Flanders. Several raids have been made recently on gambling resorts in that building. On Sept. 17th ten gamblers were arrested at #83 N. 4th which is located in this building. All of them were fined \$10.00 on Oct. 18th. On Oct. 3rd fourteen more gamblers were arrested at #83 N. 4th and they were fined \$20.00 each on Oct. 9th. On Oct. 8th nine gamblers were arrested at #83 1/2 N. 4th and they were fined \$20.00 each on Oct. 27th. Oct. 11th seven gamblers were arrested at #81 N. 4th. This case has not yet been disposed of by the Court and is still pending. Oct. 16th four gamblers were arrested at 83 N. 4th and they were fined \$15.00 on the 19th inst. On Oct. 22nd five gamblers were arrested at 287 Everett which is also situated in this building. They were fined \$20.00 each on Oct. 23rd. On Oct. 23rd two Chinamen were arrested with lottery tickets in their possession and on Oct. 24th they were fined \$10.00 each. This shows conslusively that this building is one great big gambling den. It is almost impossible for the officers to get access to the gambling dens because of the heavy doors and barricades affixed to them. Some of these doors, I am informed, are four and five inches thick and it is next to impossible for the officers to break them down and I think the owners and lessees should be proceeded against for permitting gambling dens in that building.
