

## ORDINANCE No. 189335

Authorize a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the N Denver Avenue Pavement Rehabilitation Project from N Lombard St to N Watts St for an estimated \$1,335,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. On May 17th, 2016, Portland voters passed Measure 26-173, Portland's first local funding source dedicated to fixing our streets. Measure 26-173 will raise an estimated \$64 million over four years. This is the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) Fixing Our Street Program.
2. N Denver Avenue (formerly N Derby) used to be a route of "Kenton Line", early 1900's Streetcar Line that ceased operation in 1940. Over the years, streetcar rails have been used as the base overlaid with asphalt. The pavement has deteriorated to the point that rehabilitation is needed.
3. As part of the Fixing Our Streets program, PBOT will construct pavement maintenance work on N Denver Avenue from N Lombard St to N Watts St. Sections of N Denver St. have damaged base that full-depth pavement repair and rail removal will be required while other sections will need a minimum of 3" inch grind and pave.
4. Grinding and paving 3 inches meets PBOT's Pavement Management strategy of performing pavement maintenance earlier in the pavement lifecycle to prevent much higher rehabilitation costs in the future. Full depth repair of the worst section of the street is in line with the goal of Fixing Our Street Program.
5. The Bureau of Transportation has funds budgeted in FY 2018 and proposed FY 2019 for construction, inspection and management of the project.
6. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for this project is moderate, as the project scope is clearly understood and defined.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. Upon the Council's acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's report recommending the lowest responsible bidder, the Chief Procurement Office is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's office.
- b. The Auditor to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to T00583.C35 when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.




