ORDINANCE No. 189364

*Authorize a contract with Fortinet, Inc. for a Next Generation Firewall System in the amount of \$4.5 million (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Bureau of Technology Services (BTS) currently supports a complex array of firewalls which are approaching end of effective and supported service. These firewalls provide perimeter security for various critical services such as SAP and enforce security compliance. Without managed firewalls, these critical services would be exposed to attack from the internet. BTS needs to replace existing technology with next generation standards and to deploy additional security enhancements on an annual basis. This ensures the City network meets security compliance requirements for Payment Card Industry (PCI), Personally Identifiable Information (PII), and Protected Health Information (PHI HIPAA).
- 2. The City has chosen to contract with Fortinet to acquire hardware, software, implementation, training and support services for a next generation firewall system to support the City's continued critical security functions. The contract shall have a five (5)-year base with an option for an additional five (5) years, not to exceed ten (10) years total. The not to exceed amount is \$4,500,000 for life of the contract.
- 3. Fortinet subcontracts with National Consulting Architecture (NCA), as set forth in the contract with Fortinet. Payments under the Fortinet contract shall be routed through NCA as the subcontractor and Value Added Reseller (VAR) for the contract.
- 4. Procurement authority for this contract is via Permissive Cooperative Procurement through the National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance's contract # 01-77 in accordance with City Code 5.33.160. A notice of intent to use a Permissive Cooperative Procurement was publicly posted on 12/28/2018 for seven (7) days as required by 5.33.160.C. No protests were received.
- 5. Funding for this contract will be provided by the Bureau of Technology Services.
- 6. It is critical to the City's cybersecurity needs and compliance requirements for Payment Card Industry (PCI), Personally Identifiable Information (PII), and Protected Health Information (PHI HIPAA), that this contract be authorized as quickly as possible to avoid a lapse in Citywide firewall security protection.

a. The City's Chief Procurement Officer is hereby authorized to execute and amend a contract with Fortinet, Inc. for an initial term of five (5) years with an initial not-to-exceed value of \$2,250,000.00 and a total not-to-exceed value of \$4,500,000 for the total ten (10)-year contract term, provided the form has been approved by the City Attorney's Office.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the City needs to act promptly for BTS to replace Citywide firewalls to protect technology assets and City information resources and to ensure continuity of the City network security services. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
