

ORDINANCE No. 189371

* Accept and appropriate a grant in the amount of \$4,955 from the State of Oregon, Oregon Military Department, Office of Emergency Management for the 2018 State Homeland Security Program to fund a low-tech system for tracking disaster response personnel (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds

1. The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) applied to OEM for a grant in the amount of \$4,955 for the 2018 State Homeland Security Grant Program in January 2018; and
2. The United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Grant Programs Directorate (GPD) notified OEM of the 2018 State Homeland Security Grant Program award;
3. OEM has notified the City of Portland that it will award a subgrant for the 2018 State Homeland Security Grant Program to PBEM in the amount of \$4,955;

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland a grant from the OEM for the 2018 State Homeland Security Grant Program in the amount of \$4,955 and to execute the grant agreement.
- b. The FY 2018/2019 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Fund – 217

Business Area – EM

Bureau Program Expenses – \$4,955

- c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.
- d. The Director of PBEM of the City of Portland is authorized to accept on behalf of the City of Portland any subsequent modifications by OEM for the 2018 State Homeland Security Grant Program, 18-248, provided such modifications do not increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City of Portland's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Portland City Council.

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Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
