Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The purpose of this legislation is to formally withdraw the City of Portland, through the Portland Police Bureau from the Joint Terrorist Task Force as authorized in Resolution 37113. This legislation does not preclude the Police Bureau from working with the FBI on terrorism investigations on a case by case basis.

Please see attached testimony of Michael German, Fellow, Brennan Center for Justice at New York University School of Law, Liberty and National Security Program; and Former Special Agent, Federal Bureau of Investigation as provided to City Council on April 18, 2018 for background on the JTTF and its impacts on Portland communities.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

This legislation does not amend the budget, change staffing levels, or have any budgetary impacts. While Resolution 37113 and its accompanying memorandum of understanding allow the Portland Police Bureau to request reimbursement for overtime pay for the two officers assigned to the JTTF, from the FBI, it is unclear if this has happened.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Community involvement includes a publicly announced community forum held on Wednesday January 16th, a public work session, public testimony, and six individuals invited for testimony; 3 for and 3 opposing.
