## ORDINANCE No. 189410

Reauthorize agreements with the Confluence Environmental Center to support the goals of the Portland Watershed Management Plan for an annual aggregate amount not to exceed \$30,000 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

- Section 1. The Council finds:
  - 1. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) needs to manage stormwater to protect and promote human and watershed health. The 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan describes actions for watershed health, including stormwater management, revegetation, community involvement, and stewardship.
  - 2. The City aims to administer and deliver services in a way that gives all Portlanders access to the opportunity necessary to satisfy their essential needs, advance their well-being, and achieve their full potential. Equity in service delivery is a core BES value.
  - The Confluence Environmental Center (CEC) provides AmeriCorps service members for 11-month service terms to address watershed health, environmental education, and energy/resource conservation projects in low-income, racially diverse, and vulnerable communities. CEC AmeriCorps members help BES build capacity for equitable service delivery.
  - 4. BES has sponsored AmeriCorps members through the CEC since FY11-12. Entering into agreements with CEC was previously authorized by Council from FY11-12 to FY13-14 (Ordinance #183686) and FY14-15 to FY18-19 (Ordinance #186754).
  - The current cost for two AmeriCorps members is \$27,000 annually. To allow for cost increases, aggregate annual cost is not to exceed \$30,000 for five fiscal years (FY19-20 through FY23-24). Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY19-20 Budget, ESWS000015. Future funding will be requested through annual budget processes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of BES is authorized to execute agreements, in substantially the same form as Exhibit A attached herein, in an annual aggregate amount not to exceed \$30,000, with the CEC for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Director of BES is authorized to execute amendments to these agreements, provided that such amendments do not adjust the annual aggregate amount to exceed \$30,000.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the contract from the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.


