Oregon Tradeswomen is now in our 30th year advocating for strong programming to support our region's jobseekers with good careers in the skilled trades, and in particular, women and people of color. Because many of our community's jobseekers have barriers to employment, it is critical for them to have not only quality job readiness training and skills-building, but access to supportive services. Through the Employment Opportunity Program (EOP), Oregon Tradeswomen is able to serve hundreds of women annually who otherwise would not be able to be successful in our preapprenticeship training program or in skilled trade's career pathways.

The EOP has provided students in our free, 8-week apprenticeship readiness program with the support necessary for entering full-time employment in an industry, which while fulfilling and well-paid, has many challenges. Providing the job coaching, case management, retention support and other tangible resources such as housing support, including rental assistance, childcare, and transportation assistance, have made the difference for hundreds of our program graduates.

Oregon Tradeswomen is grateful for the coordination and management of the EOP funds by WorkSystems Inc., who not only is a funder, but provides on-going programming support, strategic resources, and innovative funding leverage for programs such as ours to ensure women in our community are moved from poverty to prosperity in the skilled trades. We appreciate the partnership and encourage continued funding for, and administration, by Worksystems for EOP.

One recent graduate story we would like to share with you is a young woman named Vanessa T. Vanessa began our job readiness program just two days after exiting the adult corrections system. Challenged with having absolutely nothing to her name, no job, no income, and no training, Vanessa heard about our program while incarcerated. Through the support of our case management team, she was able to access resources, including housing assistance because of EOP. Vanessa graduated from our program last week, moved into her own apartment and started a job making family-supporting wages for a Portland company. Without EOP, we would not be able to share this success story.

Thank you for your support to ensure jobseekers can have access to the support needed to have a career path to family wage jobs, economic security, and a future career that will serve not only our workforce, but our industry and region well.
