ORDINANCE No. 189435

* Authorize the Bureau of Emergency Management to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements with additional subrecipients of the Urban Area Security Initiative 2016, grant no. 16-170 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Department of Homeland Security provides financial assistance to selected urban areas through its Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. The City of Portland acts as the grantor to regional partners.
- 2. Funding under the FY 2016 Urban Areas Security Initiative grant no. 16-170 has been allocated and approved under Ordinance 188460.
- 3. Funds will be used to reimburse costs for projects planned and executed through the Regional Disaster Preparedness Organization (RDPO), for which the City of Portland is a core member. The RDPO has completed a regional strategy to guide the use of federal homeland security grant funds in the Portland Urban Area. The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) will administer the intergovernmental agreements for the region.
- 4. Ordinance 188640 included a directive allowing the Director of PBEM to executive Intergovernmental Agreements related to UASI 2016, grant no. 16-170 and amendments to these Intergovernmental Agreements with TriMet; Port of Portland; Multnomah, Clackamas, Washington, and Columbia Counties of Oregon; and Clark County Washington.
- 5. There are now additional special districts and cities that qualify as subrecipients under UASI 2016, that the City of Portland plans to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements under UASI 2016, grant no. 16-170.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Director of Portland Bureau of Emergency Management of the City of Portland is hereby authorized to enter into Intergovernmental Agreements and amendments to these Intergovernmental Agreements with additional, qualifying UASI 2016, grant no. 16-170 subrecipients.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would unnecessarily delay the City's ability to perform the activities authorized by the grant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
