Julie Livingston is recommended for reappointment to the Portland Design Commission. Julie has demonstrated exceptional participation in her service on the Design Commission, and most critically during her last year as Chair. Julie has been a notable presence in volunteer task forces, meetings, studies etc. that increase the stability, the consistency, transparency and effectiveness of the process. Beyond the weekly review of applications, site visits and hearings, Julie has also given additional time to improving our hearings, review and process. These efforts have included numerous reoccurring meetings with the Portland Housing Bureau, Portland Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, Portland Bureau of Transportation, Regional Arts and Culture Council and the Landmarks Commission. Not only has Julie participated in these undertakings, but she has written numerous narratives to be considered in ongoing revisions to these documents. Reappointing Julie to a second term would help maintain her strong presence and momentum in these important efforts towards Design Review and Design Commission process improvements. If reappointed, Julie's second term would be from May 7, 2019 through May 6, 2023.

I've been employed by Home Forward, an organization with a well-known focus on equity, for 21 years. Home Forward's mission statement includes an explicit commitment to people who experience barriers to housing because of income, disability or special need. During my tenure on Portland Design Commission, we have used grass roots recruitment strategies that have successfully moved the needle on diversity. The seven member Commission currently has a record three women and record four people of color.
