SUBJECT: Accept the 2018 Title 11 Trees Trust Funds report (Report)

I am pleased to submit for your consideration the annual report on the two Urban Forestry trust funds established by Title 11, Trees. This report summarizes the revenue, expenditures, uses, and plans for the Urban Forestry Fund and the Tree Planting and Preservation Fund from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

In total, PP&R used the Tree Planting and Preservation Fund to complete Portland's first Citywide Tree Planting Strategy, *Growing a More Equitable Urban Forest*, and plant more than 2,000 trees in parks, natural areas, and at schools across the city. PP&R used the Urban Forestry Fund to complete the second year of inventorying trees in developed parks for the first time, including training and support for the more than 1,200 community volunteers who have served over 20,000 hours on the Tree Inventory Project to date

This report was shared with the Urban Forestry Commission and is posted on Portland Parks & Recreation's (PP&R) Urban Forestry website. PP&R Urban Forestry will continue to report annually as required by Title 11 Trees.

We are excited to have these resources with which to improve and expand the city's tree canopy, and we look forward to reporting progress in the future.
