ORDINANCE No. 189510

Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County in an amount not to exceed \$197,160 and extend funding through March 31, 2020, for the Forensic Consultant contract expenses related to the National Sexual Assault Kit Initiative Program (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30005612)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) awarded supplemental grant funding to the City under the Federal Fiscal Year 2016 (FFY 2016) National Sexual Assault Kit Initiative (SAKI) Solicited – Strategic Initiatives in April 2017;
- 2. The SAKI Program addresses the issue of unsubmitted sexual assault kits (USAKs) at the Portland Police Bureau;
- 3. The City has an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Multnomah County Office of the District Attorney (MCDA) to reimburse them for half of their Forensic Consultant's contract. The Forensic Consultant provides expertise regarding the analysis of the USAKs, Combined D-N-A (DNA) Index System (CODIS) eligibility, victim communication, and trial preparation for Police Bureau USAK cases;
- 4. The City wishes to amend existing Contract No. 30005612 with MCDA to add \$99,000 for the SAKI grant program; and
- 5. This amendment will extend the term of the Agreement through the grant program end date March 31, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to execute an amendment to Contract 30005612 between the City and MCDA as outlined in a form similar to the amendment attached as Exhibit A.
- b. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement from the Grantor, and to submit required online grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

c. The Chief of the Police Bureau, their designate, or the Grant Site Coordinator are authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent modifications to this Agreement provided such modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by Council.
