ORDINANCE No. 189534 As Amended

*Revise residential solid waste and recycling collection rates and charges, effective July 1, 2019 (Ordinance; amend Code Chapter 17.102)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Ordinance No. 164701, passed October 2, 1991, granted residential solid waste, recycling and yard debris collection franchises in the City of Portland to introduce service and implement standards and rates to encourage increased recovery of recyclable material from the waste stream.
2. Ordinance No. 189242, passed November 7, 2018, renewed the residential franchise system for a twelve-year term.
3. As specified by Section 8 of the residential collection franchise agreement, the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability's Solid Waste and Recycling Program conducted an annual rate review during the spring of 2019 to evaluate the cost of providing collection services, based on actual data on costs and management operations.
4. The rate review shows that most rates will increase by \$0.80 due to increased tipping fees for yard debris and food scraps as well as the voter-approved Portland Clean Energy Fund one percent surtax on the business license fee.
5. Bureau of Planning and Sustainability staff recommend that the Council approve the proposed amendments to the residential rate schedule, as set forth in Exhibit A to this Ordinance.


NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. City Code Chapter 17.102 shall be amended by deleting the existing Figure 6, *Residential Solid Waste and Recycling Rates*, and replacing it with the new Figure 6 in Exhibit A.
- b. The rates identified in Exhibit A shall be effective on and after July 1, 2019.


