Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

The Bull Run Watershed currently provides high quality water to those in the Portland metro area. It is currently a protected area, limiting certain activities, to ensure the overall health of the watershed and forest area. This action proposes amending the City Charter to include and maintain those same protections through a referral to the November 2019 ballot.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

There will be a total of three referrals to the November 2019 ballot associated with the City's water system. The cost of all three referrals has a low confidence estimation of under \$390,000.

Community impacts and community involvement:

Language for these amendments has been available for public comment and was presented at the Portland Utility Board's June 2nd meeting. Portland voters will have the opportunity to engage in this issue and cast their final decision in the November 2019 election.

Due to a grammatical error, the following changes are needed in the last paragraph of Exhibit A to Agenda Item 625. The amendment will be presented at the Council meeting on June 26, 2019.

Development in the Bull Run Watershed Closure Area that is allowed by the Charter must first seek to avoid, then minimize and mitigate for impacts to water quantity and quality, cultural resources, and the natural environment including soils, vegetation, and fish and wildlife and related habitat, to the greatest extent practicable. Public notice of development inside the Bull Run Watershed Closure Area is required and all development must comply with the Bull Run Watershed Protection provisions of the Portland City Code.
