ORDINANCE No. 189583 As Amended

Authorize a competitive solicitation and contract for the Photographic Traffic Enforcement System and related services (Ordinance)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. On June 17, 2015, City Council adopted Resolution 37130 with the goal of Vision Zero to eliminate traffic deaths and serious injuries on streets in Portland.
- Vision Zero is the City of Portland's acknowledgment that Portland families
 deserve safe streets on which to walk, bike, operate mobility devices, access
 transit, and drive. Enforcement of traffic safety laws is a critical component in the
 success of the City of Portland's Vision Zero mission;
- 3. Expanding the safety camera programs is among the 32 identified actions in the Vision Zero Action Plan to eliminate all traffic deaths and serious injuries, specifically actions to address speed and dangerous behaviors;
- 4. The Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) and the Portland Police Bureau (PPB) have developed shared safety objectives and implementation strategies, as well as having achieved legislative authority to use automated traffic enforcement;
- Working as partners, these Bureaus participate in traffic safety efforts to foster the advancement of the City's Vision Zero Goal through photographic traffic enforcement of speeding and red light running using a system that includes fixed position cameras, mobile cameras, and red light cameras;
- The vendor providing and maintaining the current photographic traffic enforcement system was selected 10 years ago, and a competitive solicitation is needed to ensure that PBOT and PPB have the latest technologies available to them in continuing their traffic enforcement partnership;
- 7. The current traffic enforcement system is designed to be self-funding, and the solicitation will incorporate this design into the proposed upgrade project;
- An upgrade to this system is timely and important to these bureaus' efforts to enforce traffic safety and attain the City's Vision Zero goal; during the last five years, there has been an annual average of 38 traffic deaths in the City of Portland; and
- PBOT and PPB are interested in completing a competitive solicitation process and initiating the project in the first half of Fiscal Year 2019-20.
- 10. The Bureau's level of confidence in the estimated contract value for this this system and related services is moderate.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Chief Procurement Officer to facilitate the use of a competitive solicitation process in accordance with City Code 5.33 for the procurement of Photographic Traffic Enforcement system and related services.
- b. Upon Council acceptance of the Chief Procurement Officer's Report, the Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to negotiate and execute a contract with the selected vendor for an estimated contract value amount not to exceed \$15,000,000, provided the contract has been approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office.
