

## **ORDINANCE No. 189600**

\*Authorize \$75,000 total in grant funds for the Constructing Civic Dialogues Grant Program in the Office of Community & Civic Life (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

### Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Constructing Civic Dialogue Grant Program ("CCD") provides multicultural, multilingual, and community-specific training and/or services to build community capacity to promote the common good through constructive dialogue.
2. The grant will allow services to be provided at no charge to individuals and groups referred by City bureaus and community partners from entities with demonstrated experience in their area of expertise to foster understanding of differing perspectives, generative public dialogue, and constructive conflict.
3. After selecting five grantees in 2018, the Office of Community and Civic Life ("Civic Life") identified a gap in services. Civic Life asked Portland United Against Hate ("PUAH"), an established partner, to submit a grant application for FY 2019-20. PUAH, through its coalition of participating organizations, has demonstrated experience in the following areas: hate violence education and awareness training; applying equity and inclusion to civic processes; fostering interconnected communities and a sense of belonging among its diverse members; providing multicultural, multilingual, and community-specific engagement.
4. Grantee will provide this expertise through trainings, skill building, problem-solving services, and other interactive opportunities that build common understanding from unique perspectives.
5. This money comes from the Civic Life general fund allocation for CCD.
6. Civic Life has determined PUAH is qualified to provide the services in accordance with the City of Portland grant contract agreement language. The City Attorney's Office has approved the grant agreement attached in a form substantially in accordance with Exhibit 'A' that specify the scope of the projects to be conducted by the grantee and the funds to be allocated.
7. Civic Life recommends a total of \$75,000 for FY 2019-20 PUAH grant award. Project start date for fiscal year 2019-2020 is July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 for a twelve-month period June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020, with option for one-year extension contingent upon deliverables and available funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Director of the Office of Community & Civic Life is authorized to execute the Constructing Civic Dialogues grant agreement with Southeast Uplift Neighborhood Program, Inc. in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit 'A' and in an amount not to exceed \$75,000.
- b. Amendments to the grant agreement, including Scope of Work, Budget, and grant dollar amount, may be agreed to and executed by the Director of the Office of Community & Civic Life or their designee provided those amendments do not increase the fiscal risk to the City.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because a delay in funding could result in delay in no charge services to foster understanding of differing perspectives, generative public dialogue, and constructive conflict to the community through this amendment. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.


