## TO THE COUNCIL:

The Leach Garden is a 17-acre botanical garden located in East Portland, and it serves as both a neighborhood open space and regional botanical educational destination. The garden is run in partnership by Leach Garden Friends (LGF), a non-profit organization and PP&R. For the past 5 years, PP&R and LGF have completed strategic development planning, land-use permits and construction documentation for the Leach Upper Garden Development Project.

The Garden is a City landmark and treasure and requires significant upgrades and seeks to become a nationally identified special place. The project has many complexities which will require creativity and special expertise to sequence and complete effectively. The Project will construct a pollinator garden, a wooded hillside garden, an aerial tree walk, public gathering spaces, an expanded pedestrian pathway system and other site infrastructure improvements.

The Council adopted Ordinance No. 189427 on March 20, 2019 that approved findings, authorized an exemption to the competitive low bid requirements, authorized the alternative contracting method of 2-Step Negotiated RFP for the Project, and authorized payment for the construction of the Leach Upper Garden Project.

A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) Number 00001202 was issued on March 22, 2019, for the construction of the Leach Upper Garden project. Two (2) prime contractors and three (3) subcontractors responded and all were determined qualified and invited to participate in the Step 2 Request for Proposals.

A Request for Proposals for the Leach Botanical Garden Upper Development, RFP No. 00001241, was issued on May 6, 2019. Two (2) proposals were received, reviewed, evaluated, and scored by a five (5)-member evaluation committee including one (1) member of the Minority Evaluator Program in accordance with Portland City Code 5.34. The evaluation committee selected James W. Fowler Company as the highest scoring proposer.

The Chief Procurement Officer recommends the award of a contract to James W. Fowler Company for the construction of the Leach Botanical Garden Upper Development for the Negotiated Price of \$8,185,616.

The City has established an aspirational goal for State of Oregon COBID certified Disadvantaged, Minority, and Women owned firms as well as Emerging Small Businesses and Service-Disabled Veteran owned businesses (D/M/W/ESB/SDVBE) in subcontractor and supplier utilization at 20% of the hard construction costs for the project. James W. Fowler Company has made a commitment of 34.64% utilization of COBID certified subcontractors, material suppliers and manufacturers on this project of which 22.98% is DBE and 11.66% is ESB. James W. Fowler has committed to date a total of \$2,835,118.00 utilization of COBID certified contractors as detailed:

Additionally, James W. Fowlers has committed to utilizing Pacific Landscape Services, Inc. for Landscape Services whose State of Oregon COBID certification was pending and approved on July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019. This change increases dollars going State of Oregon COBID firms from \$2,835,118 (34.64%) to \$4,524,569 (55.28%).

James W. Fowler is located in Dallas, Oregon, and is not a State Certified D/M/W/ESB Contractor. They have a current City of Portland Business Tax Registration and EEO Certification, and are in Full Compliance with the City's contracting requirements.

Funds are available for this project under Owner Cost Center P10515.

It is recommended that a Performance Bond and Payment Bond each at 100% of the contract amount be furnished by the Contractor. Further, it is also recommended that a two (2) year Maintenance/Warranty Bond for 20% of the final contract amount be furnished by the Contractor before final payment is released.

The bid sureties of the remaining bidders should be returned immediately in compliance with Section 5.34.410D of the City Code.
