## ORDINANCE No. 189625 As Amended

\*Authorize a \$543,600 State of Oregon traffic enforcement grant agreement and appropriate \$271,800 in traffic enforcement funds for FY 2019-20 to reimburse overtime expenses of sworn personnel on patrol in identified State Work Zones (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

## Section 1. The Council finds:

- The Police Bureau wishes to apply for and accept the state of Oregon's Department of Transportation (ODOT) Traffic Safety Division (TSD) Work Zone 2019-2021 Program grant award;
- 2. The ODOT TSD has notified the City it will award \$543,600 in federal grant funds for reimbursement of Work Zone 2019-2021 program activities;
- The ODOT TSD program will reimburse the City for overtime expenses incurred by the Police Bureau Traffic Division officers and sergeants who provide high visibility and contact enforcement efforts while on patrol in identified ODOT Work Zones;
- 4. Local match in the amount of \$64,000 will be provided by funds from Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021 bureau program budget appropriations; and
- 5. The grant period is the date of the fully-executed award document through June 30, 2021.

## NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Mayor is authorized to execute a \$543,600 state of Oregon traffic enforcement grant agreement in a form similar to Exhibit A attached to this Ordinance.
- b. The FY 2019-2020 budget will be amended as follows:

## **GRANTS FUND**

Fund - 217

Business Area - PL

Bureau Program Expenses - \$271,800

c. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Management Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant application, grant agreement or amendments, requests for reimbursement to the grantor, and submission of required grant documents on the Mayor's behalf.

d. The Chief of the Portland Police Bureau is authorized to accept on behalf of the City any subsequent modifications to the grant agreement described in section *a*, provided the modifications do not increase the City's financial obligation or risk. Any modifications that increase the City's financial obligation or risk must be authorized by the Council.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because it is in the public interest to get the grant as quickly as possible; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
