ORDINANCE No. 189638

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County, the City of Fairview, the City of Gresham, the City of Troutdale, and the City of Wood Village to oversee a Municipal Broadband feasibility study (Ordinance)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. As part of the FY 2018-19 Special Appropriations process, the City of Portland granted the Municipal Broadband Coalition of America \$25,000 as a contribution to a "feasibility study looking at constructing, financing and operating a municipal telecommunications utility within Multnomah County" under the category of expanding economic opportunities for Portlanders.
- 2. The Municipal Broadband Coalition of America registered as a social welfare organization operating under IRC section 501(c) 4 that states it "provides education, advocacy, and guidance to communities interested in building publicly-owned internet infrastructure...[and] are dedicated to bringing reliable, competitive broadband internet access to everyone in the United States."
- 3. The mission for the Office for Community Technology is to build community capacity and to champion investments and public policy in a rapidly changing communications technology, utility and broadband landscape to keep our local communities economically and culturally healthy.
- 4. The Office for Community Technology is the appropriate bureau to represent the City of Portland in the City's participation in the Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) for a municipal broadband feasibility study. A copy of the IGA is attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit A and is incorporated by reference. The draft Statement of Work is attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit B and is incorporated by reference.
- 5. The Office for Community Technology will continue efforts to explore all options, including but not limited to this municipal broadband feasibility study that will lead to broadband accessibility and adoption for all Portland residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into the Intergovernmental Agreement with Multnomah County, the City of Fairview, the City of Gresham, the City of Troutdale, and the City of Wood Village.
