ORDINANCE No. 189648

Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Bureau of Environmental Services and the Port of Portland for use of each agencies compressed natural gas fueling facility in the event that such party's facility is inoperable not to exceed \$1,000 per calendar year (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) utilizes compressed natural gas (CNG) vehicles. Some of these CNG vehicles require daily fueling using the City's sole CNG fueling facility located at the Columbia Boulevard Wastewater Treatment Plant (CBWTP).
- 2. BES sought to identify and utilize alternative CNG fueling sources in the event the BES CBWTP CNG fueling facility was to become inoperable.
- 3. BES would like to establish a partnership with the Port of Portland for CNG fueling. The Port of Portland has a reliable CNG fueling facility at their Airport site.
- 4. BES and the Port of Portland seek to establish an agreement where the Port shall have the nonexclusive right to utilize City's Facility for the fueling of the Port's CNG-operated vehicles in the event the Port's Facility is inoperable; and City shall have the nonexclusive right to utilize the Port's Facility for the fueling of City's CNG-operated vehicles in the event the City's Facility is inoperable.
- 5. Each party shall pay the other party's fuel costs for the actual amount of fuel used at the thencurrent Market Price or such other price as may be mutually agreed upon by BES and the Port of Portland. The established cost is estimated to be approximately \$1000 per calendar year. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Budget, FY 19-20 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, ESWW000021.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner-in-Charge is authorized to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Port of Portland, in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached to this ordinance, for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the Intergovernmental Agreement from the Sewer System Operating Fund budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.

c. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute subsequent amendments to the Intergovernmental Agreement, as needed for all amendments authorized by this Ordinance
