Fee Recommendation

The Portland Housing Bureau and the Revenue Division recommend an annual residential rental unit registration fee rate of \$60 per year

- Regulated affordable housing (60% AMI and below) exempt from the fee, but subject to the registration requirement
- Fee adjusted annually using the Consumer Price Index West
- With the average market rate rent in Portland being \$1,425 per month, the fee equates to approximately 1/3 of one percent of the annual average Portland rent

Select Comparison Jurisdictions

- Gresham: \$55, plus \$20 to \$45 per additional unit
- Minneapolis: \$70 to \$700 per building, plus per unit fee
- Seattle: \$175, plus \$2 per additional unit
- Philadelphia: \$55 per unit
- Dallas: \$43 for single family, \$6 for multifamily
