

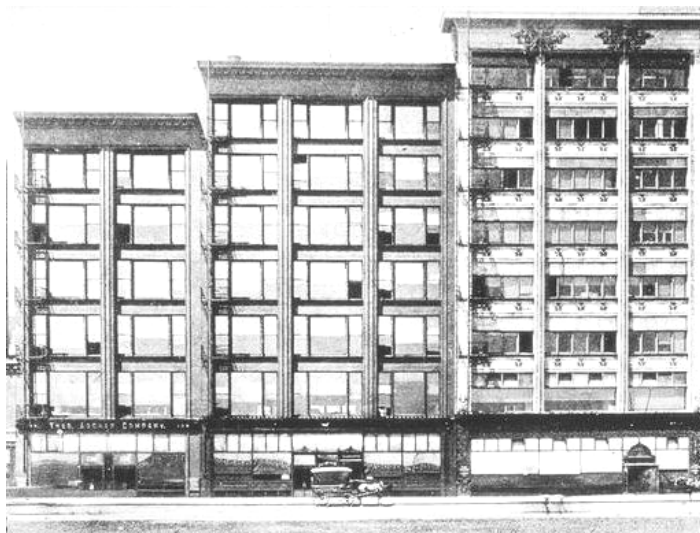
American Architecture, Architectural History & Historic Preservation

A Selected Bibliography

This bibliography lists sources on architecture, architectural history, engineering and construction, public works, interiors, landscapes, urban design, city planning, urbanization and other aspects of the built environment. It includes historical, sociological and cultural studies, criticism, style guides, encyclopedias, bibliographies, and other reference works. Many general and theoretical works on historic preservation are included, however, those concentrating on practical and technical aspects of preserving and restoring historic structures are listed in separate bibliography, *Preservation, Restoration and Rehabilitation of Historic Structures*, as are most works on the history and use of specific building materials. The geographic focus is broadly national; regional or city-specific studies are generally not included. While it may prove useful in many contexts, this bibliography is especially intended to work as a companion to *Architecture, Architectural History & Historic Preservation in Portland & Oregon: A Selected Bibliography*. Together, they will help researchers, preservationists and citizens document and appreciate Portland-area historic resources within the broader contexts of regional and American architecture and history.
