Ordinance No. 189679

Authorize the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to contract with Neighborhoods West-Northwest Review Board and Southeast Uplift Neighborhood Program, Inc. for community groups to perform Community Collection Events for FY 2019-20 at a total cost of \$15,205 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- Since 1991, the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability (BPS) has partnered with Metro to financially support Portland neighborhoods and community organizations who hold Community Collection Events (Events).
- 2. An IGA with Metro also partially funds Events, with an additional City contribution of \$16,000 in FY 2019-2020.
- 3. As a main partner and fiscal agent to community groups, District Coalition Offices (Coalitions) help BPS meet BPS program goals. The services the Coalitions provide are important to the City because Coalitions provide the community groups with support and offer a vital link between said groups and City government.
- 4. In FY 2017-2018, over 1,100 volunteers coordinated 50 Events that served 4,550 households. In addition, volunteers helped 300 senior or disabled residents dispose of unwanted bulky waste. Materials collected included 343.15 tons of mixed solid waste and 52.02 tons of metal for recycling, plus 27 of the 50 Events incorporated onsite reuse.
- 5. BPS' financial support helps to fund garbage and recycling equipment and labor, materials and supplies. In addition, BPS staff provides technical assistance to maximize the variety of materials collected for recycling and reuse at each Event; neighborhood and community volunteers staff the Events and utilize community partnerships to expand their efforts.
- 6. Emphasis this year is placed on reaching low-income community members and communities of color, and on putting usable goods in the hands of community members that need them. A one-year grant agreement allows BPS an opportunity to make any needed change to the agreement in subsequent years that may better address BPS' area of focus.
- 7. The one-year grant agreement continues BPS' long-standing partnership since 2010 with Neighborhoods West-Northwest Review Board and Southeast Uplift

Neighborhood Program, Inc. The partnership improves access to low- and nocost bulky waste collection for communities served by Neighbors West-Northwest and Southeast Uplift.

 This item is in the BPS FY 2019-2020 budget. Maximum total costs for Neighborhoods West-Northwest Review Board and Southeast Uplift Neighborhood Program, Inc.'s Events for FY 2019-2020 is \$15,205 to be allocated from the Solid Waste Management Fund; Cost Object 9PNSWR000013.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The BPS Director is hereby authorized to enter into a grant agreement with Neighborhoods West-Northwest Review Board and Southeast Uplift Neighborhood Program, Inc. in a form similar to the agreement attached as Exhibit A and B.
- b. The BPS Director is hereby authorized to execute amendments to the agreement that do not increase the City's performance obligations or financial risk.
- c. The Mayor and City Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for the agreement from the Cost Object 9PNSWR000013.
