Commission letter to be sent to State Advisory Committee on Historic Preservation on October 14, 2019.

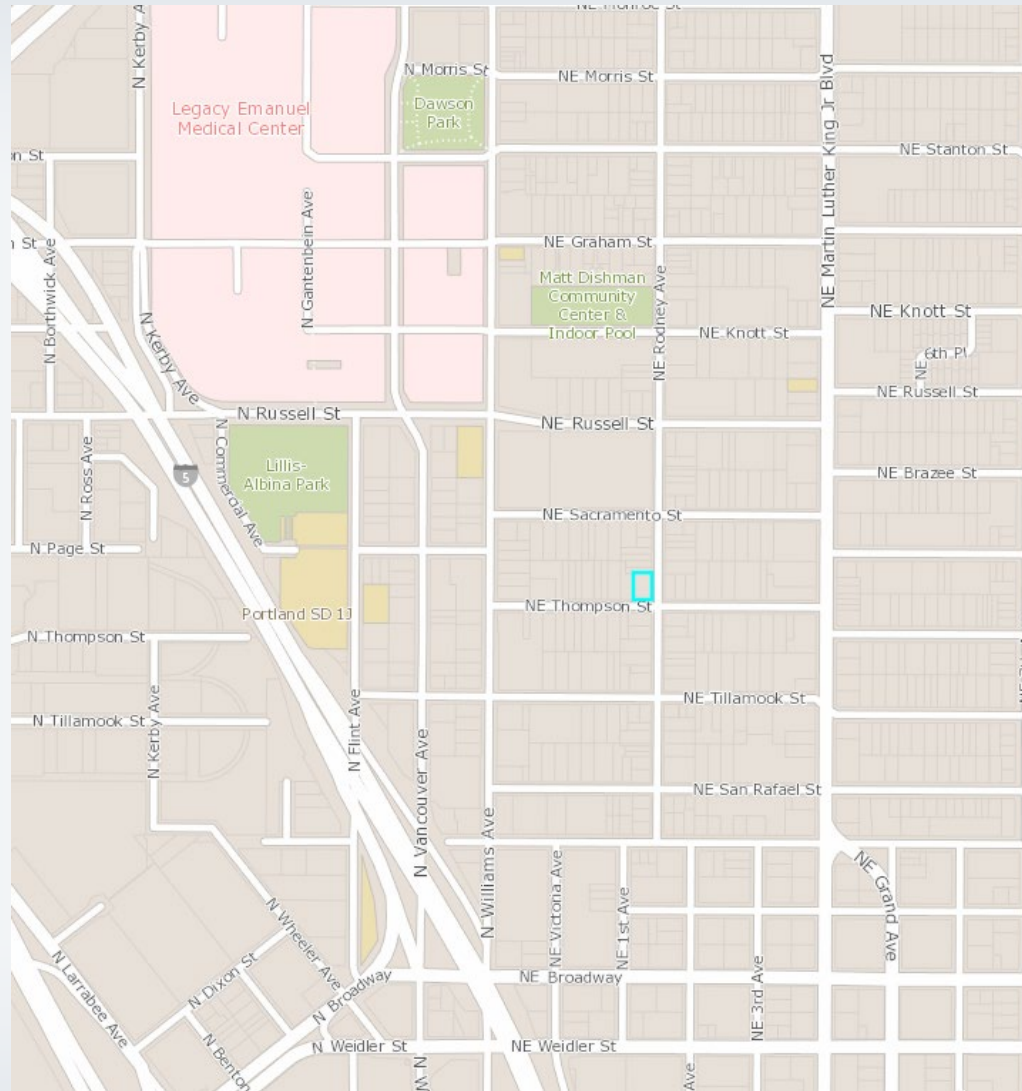
A Note About the National Register Listing Process

The National Register of Historic Places is the Nation's official list of historic resources. The listing process is intended to evaluate the historic significance and physical integrity of nominated resources. The Historic Landmarks Commission is asked to provide comments on the following topics:

- Integrity
- Description
- Significance and context
- Facts and sources
- Supporting materials

Although Oregon law requires local governments to apply demolition protections to National Register resources, these regulations are not considered in the federal listing process.

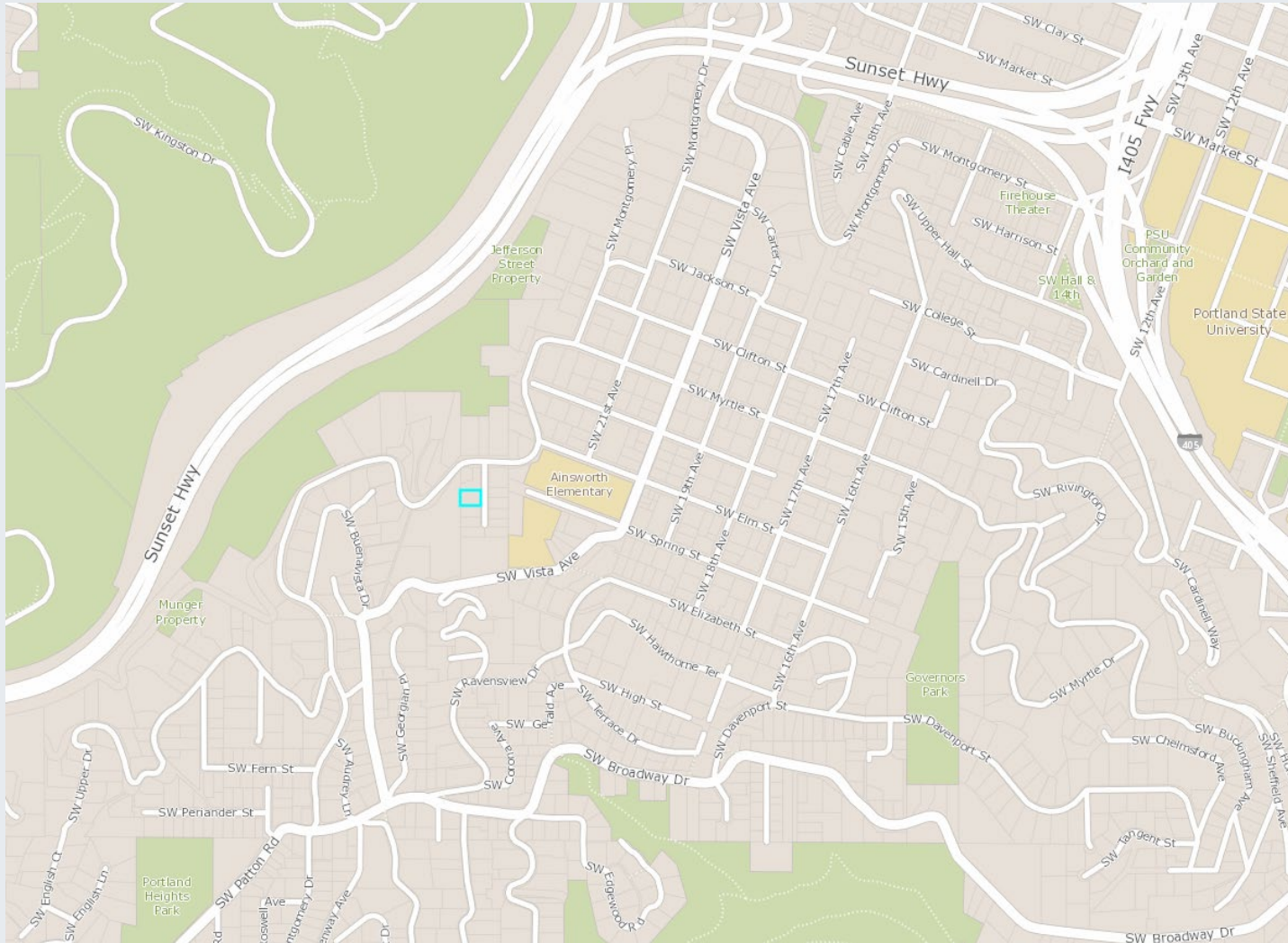

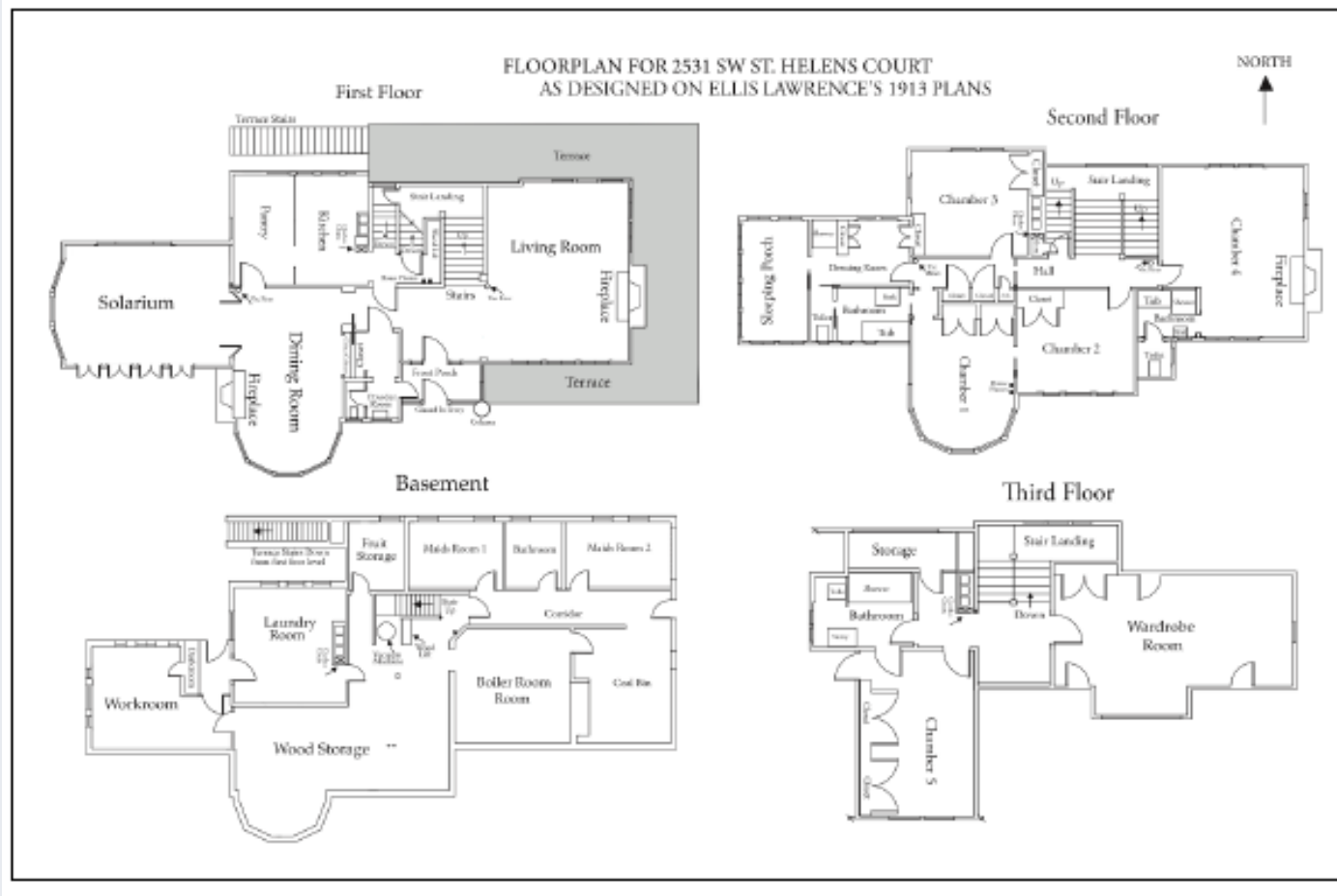

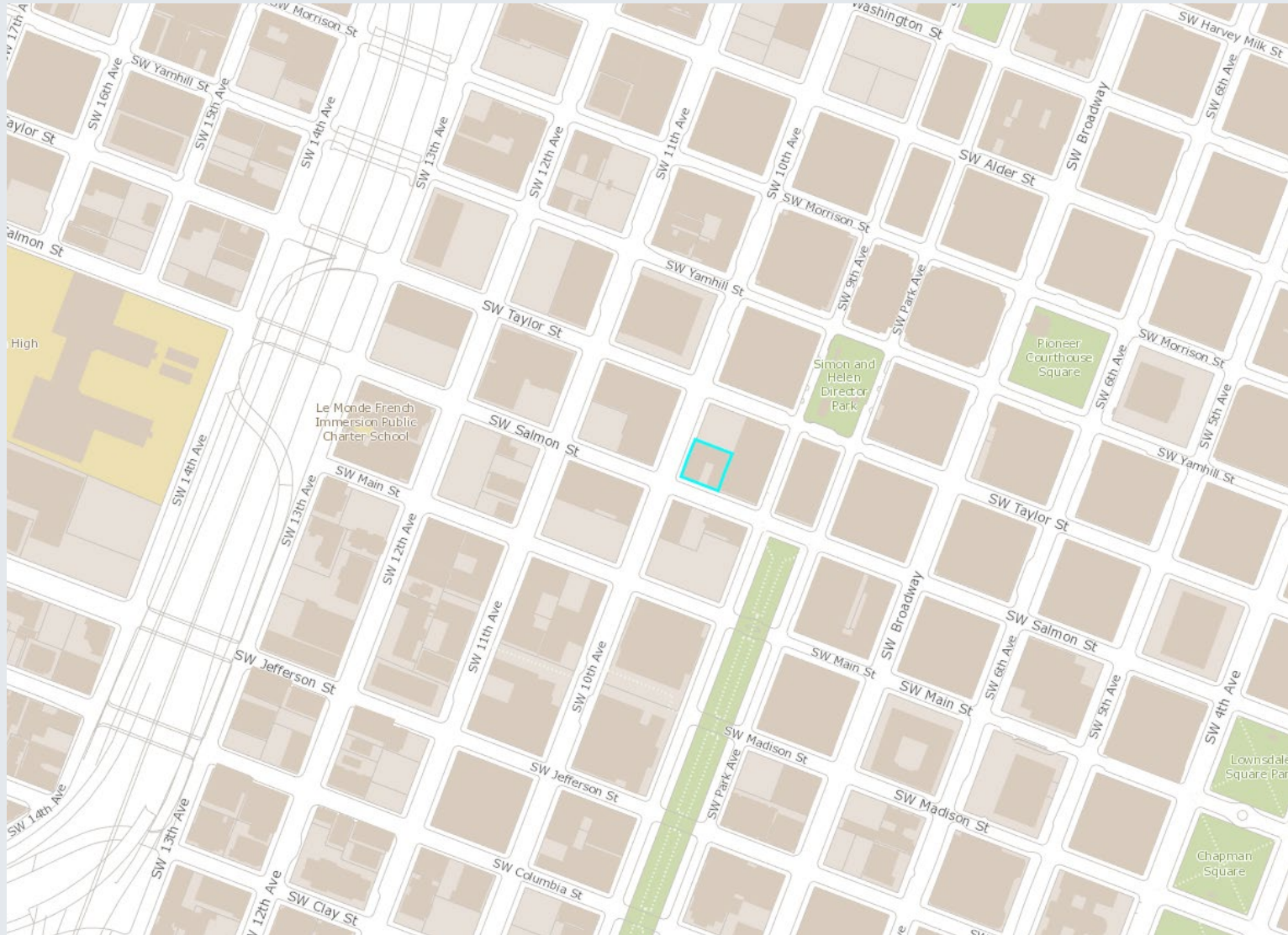

"The WHEELDON ANNEX," Portland, Oregon.

An Apartment-Hotel; a high grade house of dignity and refinement; contains apartments, hotel suites and single rooms—caters to both residents and transients. Has large lobby, billiard and card rooms, ball room, parlor and writing room, etc. Contains 70 apartments of 2, 3 and 4 room type; site 100x100; cost of building about \$135,000; value of site about \$75,000.



"THE COURT OF THE WHEELDON ANNEX"

A court of this character, paved and provided with appropriate chairs and made attractive with potted shrubs, provides a welcome resting place for the tenants and enables them to "get fresh air," at the same time adding an air of life and activity to the premises.

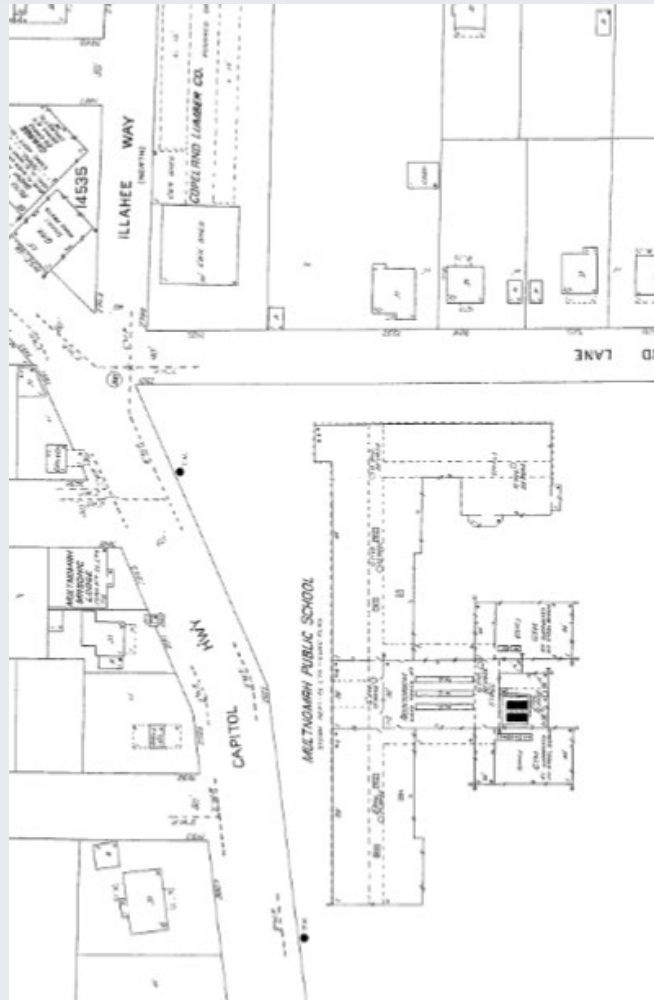

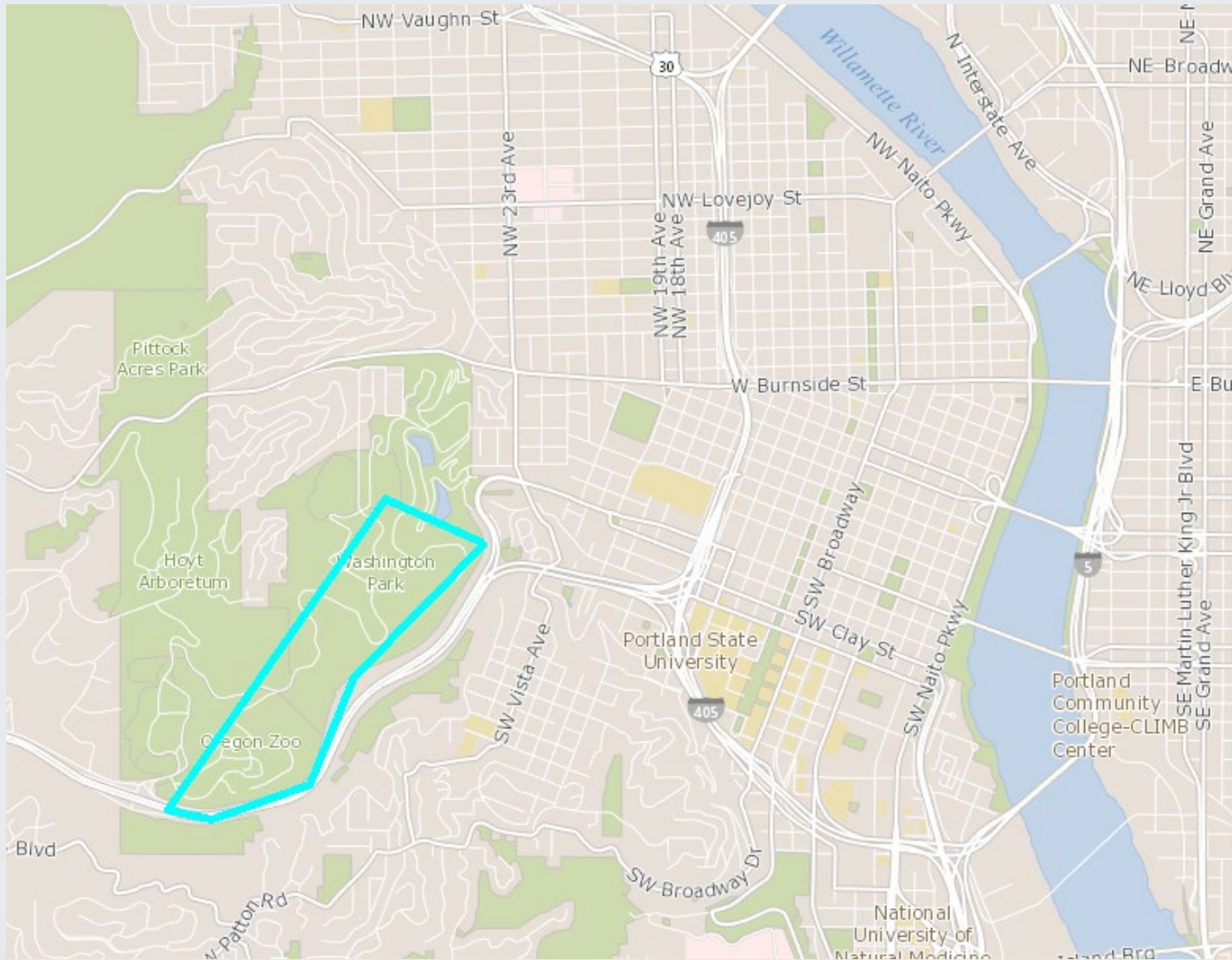

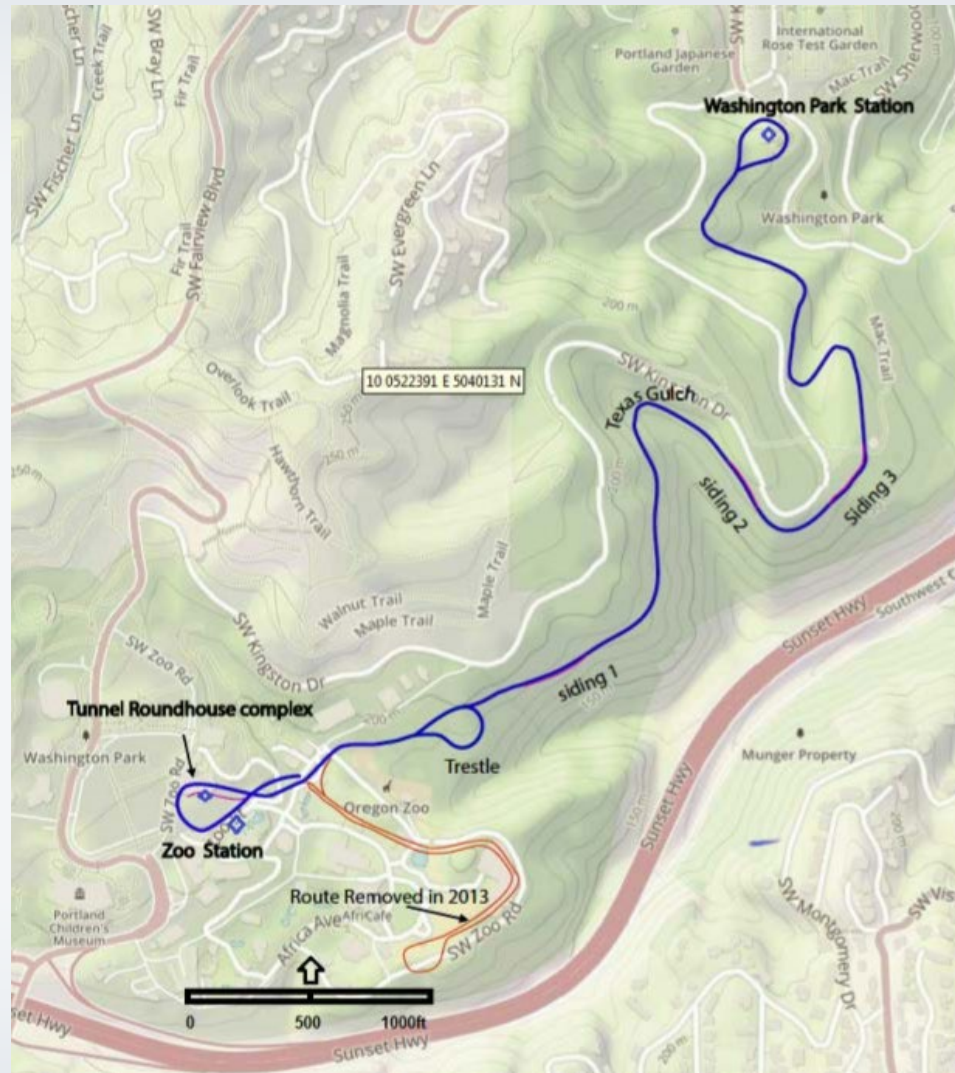

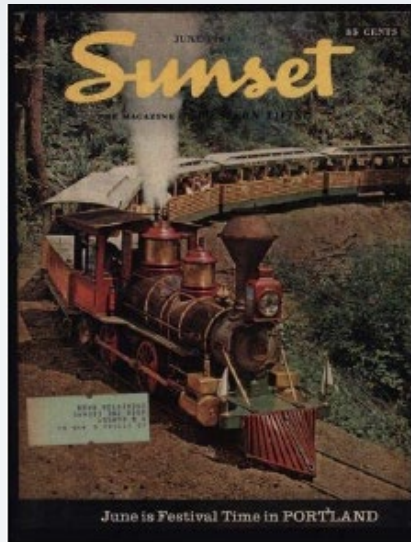
