## **ORDINANCE NO.** 189734

\* Amend subrecipient contracts with Community Energy Project by \$290,000 and Portland Community Reinvestment Initiatives, Inc. by \$70,000 to support home repair services (Ordinance; amend Contract Nos. 32001943 and 32001942)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that:

- 1. The Portland Housing Bureau (PHB) strategic goals prioritize homeownership retention for low-to-moderate income families.
- 2. As part of implementing strategic goals, PHB used a competitive Request for Proposals (RFP) process to identify organizations that provide home repair services for low-income homeowners, with services focused at serving homeowners up to 80% AMI, which is currently \$70,320 annually for a family of four.
- 3. Three proposals were received and were reviewed and scored by an Evaluation Committee comprised of community members and PHB staff.
- As a result of the RFP process, PHB will be increasing funding amounts of two existing subrecipient contracts that were executed through the Master Ordinance No. 18575.
- 5. Funding is included in the City's FY 2019-2020 approved budget in the amount of \$200,000 in Lents TIF LIFT and \$160,000 in N/NE Interstate TIF LIFT.
- \$200,000 in Lents TIF LIFT to serve 33 homeowners and \$90,000 to serve 9 homeowners in N/NE Interstate TIF LIFT will be added to Community Energy Project's Contract No. 32001943.
- 7. \$70,000 in N/NE Interstate TIF LIFT to serve 7 homeowners will be added to Portland Community Reinvestment Initiative's Contract No. 32001942.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs that:

- a. The Bureau Director or designee is authorized to execute Contract Amendments with the organizations for the amounts listed above, attached as Exhibit A and Exhibit B.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to make payments on these contracts from the PHB operating fund budget.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the program funds must be obligated within required timeframes; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by Council.
