ORDINANCE No.

An Ordinance amending sections of the Personnel Code, Title 4, relating to shift differentials, compensatory time, and personal holidays, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. That employees represented through collective bargaining this year received certain benefits relating to shift differentials, compensatory time and personal holidays.
- 2. That the Personnel Director recommends that certain sections of the Personnel Code, Title 4, be amended to reflect those changes.
- NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs that Sections 4.08.120 (a), 4.12.060, and 4.16.085 be amended as follows:

4.08.120 Shift differentials. (a) All employees assigned to work an eight-hour swing shift or graveyard shift are entitled to a shift differential as follows:

Swing Shift -- 30 cents per hour Graveyard Shift -- 35 cents per hour

4.12.060 Compensation for overtime. Overtime for an employee shall be computed at one and one-half times the base rate of pay. The normal method of compensating overtime shall be payment in cash. However, compensatory time off may be authorized in lieu of cash up to a total accrual of seventy-five (75) hours in a calendar year. Compensatory time off will be arranged by mutual agreement between the employee and the supervisor. Any accrued compensatory time remaining at the end of a calendar year will be paid in cash. If the employee transfers to another bureau, all accrued compensatory time will be paid in cash or used before such transfer.

4.16.085 Personal holidays. Unless otherwise provided in a collective bargaining agreement, full-time employees are entitled to three personal holidays effective in 1980 in addition to the holidays provided under Section 4.16.080. Credits shall be added to each eligible employee's account on the first pay date in January of each year.

A personal holiday may be scheduled only:

- (a) After six months of continuous City service;
- (b) At the mutual convenience of the employee and the bureau; and
- (c) During the calendar year in which it accrues.

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Section 2. In order that the shift differential, compensatory time, and personal holiday benefits for nonrepresented employees be provided without further delay, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
