ORDINANCE No. 189762

Authorize three Oregon Impact traffic enforcement grants for a total of \$90,000 from the State of Oregon for officer overtime reimbursement and authorize the Mayor or Chief of Police to execute future Oregon Impact grant agreements (Ordinance)

The City of Portland Ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Police Bureau wishes to apply for and accept three traffic enforcement grants;
- 2. The state of Oregon has notified the City it will award \$50,000 for reimbursement of Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants High Visibility Enforcement (DUII HVE) Grant Program activities;
- 3. The state of Oregon has notified the City it will award \$30,000 for reimbursement of Distracted Driving Enforcement Campaign (DDEC) Grant Program activities;
- 4. The state of Oregon has notified the City it will award \$10,000 for reimbursement of Pedestrian Safety Enforcement (PSE) Grant Program activities;
- 5. The state of Oregon will reimburse the City the actual officer overtime rate of pay per hour for the Traffic Division's direct enforcement of reducing impaired driving and improving traffic and pedestrian safety;
- 6. The state of Oregon requires that agencies receiving DUII HVE funds participate in two National Highway Traffic Safety Administration pre-determined HVE national events with Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police and the Oregon State Police: Christmas 2019 / New Year 2020, and Labor Day 2020;
- 7. The state of Oregon requires agencies receiving DDEC funds to focus enforcement during the month of April 2020 in coordination with National Distracted Driving Awareness Month;
- 8. The state of Oregon requires that agencies receiving PSE funds will ensure an active officer has attended the PSE training course within the past three years of working grant activities;
- A local match requirement includes City resources used to support the overtime activity, including scheduling and report compilation, as well as straight-time enforcement; and
- 10. The FY 2020 Oregon Impact grant agreements are scheduled to terminate on September 30, 2020.

NOW THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Mayor or the Chief of Police is authorized to execute three grant agreements in a form similar to the agreements attached as Exhibits A, B, and C with the state of Oregon for Oregon Impact FY 2020 DUII, HVE, DDEC, and PSE grant programs for a total amount of \$90,000.
- b. The Mayor or the Chief of Police is authorized to provide information and assurances to the state of Oregon if required by the agreements authorized by this Ordinance.
- c. The FY 2019-20 budget is hereby amended as follows:

GRANTS FUND

Fund - 217 Business Area - PL Bureau Program Expenses - \$90,000

- d. The Office of Management & Finance Grants Division is authorized to perform all administrative matters in relation to the grant applications, grant agreements, grant amendments, or requests for reimbursement, and to submit any grant documentation required to the state of Oregon.
- e. The Mayor or the Chief of the Police is authorized to execute amendments to the grant agreements authorized in Section 1.a above, including amendments that contain matching requirements.
- f. Except for Oregon Impact Program agreements or amendments that require a transfer of City funds, the Mayor or Chief of the Police is authorized to execute future Oregon Impact Program grant agreements and grant amendments with the state of Oregon, including agreements that contain matching requirements
