Leonard and Melody Jackson moved to the upstairs unit of the Commercial Avenue duplex in May, 1964. While they were there, their first child, a daughter, was born in October, 1965.

In anticipation of the PDC's acquisition of the property, Mr. James Frazier of the PDC relocation staff visited with Jacksons in early December, 1965. By mid-January, 1966, the Jacksons had purchased a one-bedroom house eight blocks from their former home, and after Mr. Chet Collinsworth of the PDC staff inspected it, they moved to that home on February 8, 1966. The following week the PDC paid a commercial moving firm \$59.06 for their move. After overcoming some obstacles in making Relocation Adjustment Payments, the PDC found the Jacksons eligible for a \$156.00 relocation adjustment payment, which the Jacksons received on November 1, 1966.

Mr. Lawrence Monk of the PDC) relocation staff discussed the Jackson's relocation with them in early June, 1966. Mrs. Jackson felt the Albina Neighborhood Improvement Project area was very run down. This, coupled with the fact that they didn't know their former neighbors very well, led her to say "I was glad to see the move, really. I was glad to see the change." In their new neighborhood, they find most of their neighbors very friendly. Jacksons live four blocks from their former back-fence neighbor, Mrs. Eddie Harris (22-2), and just over four blocks from their former landlady, Mrs. Elizabeth Summers (22-16).

About Urban Renewal in general, Mrs. Jackson commented: "I really think it helps. A lot of organizations do just talking, but Urban Renewal gets down and really sees what's going on, and does something about it."

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
