Purpose of proposed legislation and background information:

- Portland City Council passed Resolution No. 37289 in 2017, which requires the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to report progress every two years.
- Resolution No. 37289 established the following targets:

By 2035:

- 100 percent renewable electricity.
- o 2 percent community-based ownership of renewable energy generation.

By 2050:

- 100 percent renewable transportation and heating.
- 10 percent community-based ownership of renewable energy generation.
- Resolution No. 37289 contains 26 specific directives that describe a wide range of aspirations, actions and priorities for the City and its partners to achieve by 2035 and 2050. This report provides an update on progress toward these directives.

Financial and budgetary impacts:

No budget was allocated to support implementation of Resolution No. 37289.

- There are no long-term financial impacts for the City due to this report.
- This action does not amend the budget nor change current or future revenues.

Community impacts and community involvement:

- In 2017, the passage of the resolution involved community-based organizations, public utility companies and environmental and climate advocates.
- This two-year progress report was written with review and input from a range of organizations that were involved in the resolution's passage and that have been involved in implementation over the last two years, including Verde, Oregon Physicians for Social Responsibility, OPAL Environmental Justice, 350pdx and Sierra Club. New organizations such as Portland Youth Climate Council were also involved in the progress report.

100% Renewable Goal:
