- As the Preference Policy is the first of its kind in the nation, findings of this study are expected to be of broad interest

Proposed study design

- What: Gather information regarding resident's
 - Motivations for returning to the neighborhood
 - Perspectives on the neighborhood post-relocation and sense of community well-being
 - Recommendations to improve social, cultural, civic, economic, and environmental well-being

Proposed study design

How: Gather data via

- Survey (~160)
- Interviews (~20)
- Focus groups (~3)

When:

- Collect data June-July, 2019
- Analyze data August- September, 2019
- Share findings: November 2019
