AN OPEN LETTER.

To the Pioneer Voters of Oregon--

Our Brethren and Co-workers:

The undersigned, survivors among the men and women who crossed the continent with teams of oxen in the "forties" and the "fifties" of the Nineteenth Century, are now facing with whitening hair and fading vision our longed-for opportunity to secure, through your affirmative votes, the equal station with you before the law which we believe you will be proud to grant.

We have watched Old Oregon grow to its present state of development from its crudest beginnings. We, like you, have toiled and suffered in our struggles as Pioneers. Our forms, like yours, are bending under the burdens of departed years. But, unlike you, we have never enjoyed our right to a voice in making the laws we are taxed to maintain, to which, like you, we are held amenable.

On the fourth day of the coming June you will have an opportunity to cast a vote for our pending Constitutional Amendment. On the following 14th day of the month we are to meet you in our Pioneer reunion, at our annual celebration and banquet. Will you not help us in advance to make this occasion a banner day of rejoicing for the Pioneers by placing "X" between "302" and "Yes" on your ballots, and will you not endeavor to influence your friends so to vote? It is a little thing for you to do, but its effect will be to make Oregon the first ocean-bordered State of the Union to extend the elective franchise to women.
