My name is Sean Green. I own a general contracting business called Aforma and serve as vice chair of the Northeast Coalition of Neighborhoods. Over three years ago, Commissioner Eudaly's Chief of Staff, Marshall Runkel, urged me to get involved with the Development Review Advisory Committee, also known as DRAC.

At this table a year ago during my appointment, I was asked by Commissioner Fritz how well I could serve neighborhood interests given the fact that I'm also a contractor. A number of my recent efforts to make our City better have been emotionally taxing and resulted in an official city response—or a lack of a response—that is hurtful. The way in which each of you, your staff, and various city bureaus interact with each other and the community matters. Each of you sets the standards for our City and people follow your lead, more than you may realize.

I love my City. I respect and honor the commitment each of you have made to serve our community, an often thankless task, that I can only imagine is emotionally taxing. I am here to support each of you and the work you do to make our City better.
