An Ordinance adopting the Report of the Surveyors in the matter of the opening and extension of certain Streets in the City of Portland
 Whereas the Common Council of the City of Portland in Order to provide for the extension opening and establishing of certain Streets in that part of the City included in the boundaries of the Land Claim of G. Cawthas deceased, did on the 16th day of March 1870 direct the City Surveyor to make Survey for extensions of Smith Front, South Second, and South Third Streets from the South line of Shubden Street to the South line of the Cawthas Land Claim and for the improving of Streets to be known as Williams, Meads, Hooker & Morris Streets from an extension of the line of Smith Front Street to an extension of the line of South Park Street, and make his Report with plan, which said Report and Plan has been duly made and adopted by Ordinance No. 791, entitled "An Ordinance adopting the report of the City Surveyor in the matter of the proposed extension and opening of certain Streets" and Whereas afterwards to wit, on the 6th day of July 1870 the Common Council appointed J. K. Kelly, E. D. Shattuck and J. M. Ritchey Surveyors of said opening and extensions to meet for that purpose on the 20th day of July 1870 of which due notice was given by publication in the Daily Oregonian a newspaper in general circulation in the manner provided by law; And Whereas, said Surveyors met at the time and place appointed and being duly sworn have made said Survey and made their report thereon —

The City of Portland does Ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Report of J. K. Kelly, E. D. Shattuck and J. M. Ritchey Surveyors of the extension and opening of certain Streets in that part of the City included in the boundaries of the Land Claim of G. Cawthas, deceased, is hereby adopted excepting so much of said Report as relates to that part of Smith Third Street which lies South of the South line of Hooker Street, and those parts of Meads and Hooker Streets which lie West of Smith Third Street and that part of Porter Street which lies West of Smith Second Street, which said report reads as follows: "It is ordered by the Common Council of the City of Portland,

The undersigned appointed Surveyors of certain Streets in that part of the City of Portland in the boundaries of the Land Claim of G. Cawthas deceased, pursuant to Ordinance No. 791, and to notice published in the Daily Oregonian under date of July 9, 1870 respectfully report,

I. That they met at the Office of the City Clerk and Auditor in accordance with said notice on the 20th day of July, 1870, at 10 O'clock A.M., and were two and three duly sworn and then adjourned to meet on the 25th July at 10 O'clock A.M. at which time they met again and went over and viewed the ground specified in said notice and adjourned again to the 27th July 1870 at 11th O'clock P.M. at which time they met and having heard all parties interested who appeared and duly considered the matter submitted and involved in said notice and proceeding, they do assess determine and declare that some of the lands or premises through or over which the proposed streets in said notice mentioned and proposed to be extended will be rendered any less valuable by the opening and extension of said several Streets according to the provisions and promises of said Ordinance and notice,

The said Trustees do further estimate and assess and declare that none of the owners of property interested in the lands of which a portion is to be appropriated after said Streets will derive any benefit or advantages in excess of the damage sustained by the laying out opening and extension of said Streets in said Ordinance and section mentioned. And said Trustees do further assess Estimate and declare that the benefit and advantages of said Streets respectively in said Ordinance and notice mentioned to persons whose land is not taken but who are or are interested in lands within One Hundred feet of said proposed extension will be of no appreciable value, and said Trustees assess and declare as to the appropriation of each and every of the said tracts and parcels in said notice described and necessary to be appropriated that no damages will be sustained by said appropriation to the owners of property taken and no benefit will accrue in excess of damages to persons whose land is not taken.
