ORDINANCE No.

hereunder or lapse of time or any act or thing shall operate as an estoppel against the City of Portland or be held to give the permittee any vested or other right.

h. The revocable permit hereby granted is personal to the petitioner and does not run with the land, nor may it be transferred, assigned or otherwise disposed of by said petitioner.


i. The provisions of the Fire Code and generally all other applicable code and ordinance provisions and regulations of the City, whether presently existing or hereafter enacted, shall be complied with.

j. The revocable permit provided by this ordinance shall not become effective until permittee has filed with the City Auditor, in form approved by the City Attorney, a document in writing accepting the terms and conditions of this ordinance.


k. Upon the filing of such acceptance, the City Auditor shall, at the expense of the petitioner, file a certified copy of this ordinance and the acceptance thereof in the Miscellaneous Records of Multnomah County, Oregon.

Section 2. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the city of Portland in this: In order that a stand-by gas supply may be established as set forth in Section 1 hereof; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

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

ORDINANCE NO. 129914

An Ordinance granting a revocable permit to Freightliner Corporation to install one 12,000 gallon liquefied petroleum tank and an indirect-fired vaporizer with related appurtenances, at 6936 N. Fathom, under certain terms and conditions, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds that on September 25, 1969, Freightliner Corporation, 6936 N. Fathom, Swan Island, Portland, applied for a revocable permit to install a 12,000 gallon liquefied petroleum tank and an indirect-fired vaporizer in their new plant for the purpose of sustaining their plant operation during periods of fuel curtailment by the natural gas company; that it has been recommended by the Bureau of Fire and approved by the Commissioner in charge thereof, that such permit be granted under certain terms and conditions; now, therefore, Freightliner Corporation, 6936 N. Fathom, Swan Island, Portland, is hereby granted a revocable permit to install one 12,000 (WC) gallon liquefied petroleum tank and an aboveground indirect-fired vaporizer with related appurtenances, subject to the following conditions:

- (See exhibits, application under Ord. No. 4295 for 69)*
- a. The tank, vaporizer and related appurtenances, shall be installed by a qualified, licensed liquefied petroleum gas mechanic.
 - b. The installation shall be made in accordance with the basic rules and good practices established in NFPA Standard No. 58, entitled "Liquefied Petroleum Gases."
 - c. The 12,000 (WC) gallon tank shall not be located less than 50 feet from any existing building or property line, and no other building shall be erected within 50 feet of the tank without express approval by the Fire Marshal.
 - d. All liquid discharge openings shall be fitted with a remotely controlled internal shut-off valve with thermal protection. The thermal control mechanism shall have a fusible element with a melting point not over 220° F. or less than 208° F.
 - e. The combination filling inlet and lift truck fueling outlet shall be equipped with an approved barrier for protection against physical damage from vehicular movement.
 - f. All construction shall be accomplished under permit from the Bureau of Buildings of the City of Portland, and shall be in accordance with plans approved by that Bureau.
 - g. The revocable permit hereby granted shall be revocable at the pleasure of the Council and no expenditure of money
