An Ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving Portland Boulevard from the east line of Vancouver Avenue to the west line of Union Avenue

THE CITY OF PORTLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That Portland Boulevard from the east line of Vancouver, Avenue to the west line of Union Avenue

shall be improved as follows:

catastiched grade.

Sechad By constructing artificial stone eidewalks and curbs.

Third. By laying crosswalks.

Pourth By laying box gutters.

Said improvement to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Portland, and the plans, specialises, specialises, and the construction of the Auditor of the City of Portland, on the last day of September, 1915, endorsed; City Engineers, plans and specifications for the improvement of Portland Boulevard from the east line of Vancourtz avenue to this west time of Union avenue, and the estimates of the work to be done and the probable gentlement.

The over of said improvement to be as provided by the City Charter upon the property specially and specularly upon the property specially and specularly upon the property of the city Charter upon the property of the city Charter upon the property of the laying between a line 156 feet north of and parallel with the north line of Highland street and a line love feet morth of and parallel with the north line of Fortland Boulevard and beauty and the west line of Union avenue.

The City Engineers estimates of the probable lotal cost for the improvement of said boulevard is \$\$500,50.

Section 2. That said improvements shall in all respects be done and completed in conformity with the provisions of Ordinance No. 21132, smitted: "An Ordinance in relation to the improvement of streets, and declaring an emergency."

SECTION 3. The surface of the street shall be cleared of all timber, planks or other obstructions, excepting such sidewalks, crosswalks and plank roadways of the proper width, as are in good condition, and are on
the established grade, and which are not included in the estimate of the City Engineer for said improvement.

Section 4. The contractor or contractors for said improvement shall not dig up or disturb the surface of the street within the limits of said improvement for a greater distance than two blocks without having first obtained a permit so to do from the City Engineer.

Section 5. The contractor or contractors shall take entire charge of the work during its progress and shall be responsible for any loss or accident resulting from carelessness or neglect, and the improvement shall be completed to the satisfaction of the Executive Board of the said City of Portland.

SECTION 6. The contractor or contractors to whom a contract or contracts may be awarded for the completion of said improvement, shall complete the same within the time to be fixed by the Executive Board, and upon commencing said work shall continue the same without delay until completed unless the time for the completion of the improvement is extended by the Executive Board, and each contract shall contain a provision that for each day required for the completion of such contract after the expiration of the time fixed by the Executive Board there shall be forfeited by the contractor to the city the sum prescribed in Ordinance No. 19745, entitled, "An Ordinance fixing the amount to be forfeited to the city by contractors for street improvements and construction of sewers for non-completion of work within time provided by contract, and repealing Ordinance No. 15573."

Section 7. The contract or contracts shall also contain a stipulation to the effect that the person, firm or corporation to whom the contract is let shall look for payment only to the fund to be assessed upon the property liable to pay for such improvement and collected and paid into the City Treasury for that purpose, and

that they will not require the City of Portland by any legal process or otherwise to pay the same out of any other fund, except as provided by the Charter.

The contract or contracts shall also be subject to the provisions of Ordinance No. 9183, entitled, "An Ordinance to protect material men, laborers and sub-contractors, who furnish labor or material to contractors for the improvement of streets or construction of sewers."
