

(Amended by Ordinance Nos. 184046 and 188177, effective January 1, 2018.) The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability is responsible for planning, implementing, and managing complex programs and projects related to sustainability, urban design, land use, and long-range planning.

The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability:

- A. Works with the City Council, Planning and Sustainability Commission, and the community to define shared values and develop a cohesive vision for the future of Portland that are grounded in justice, racial equity, and account for historical harms to Black, Indigenous, and other communities of color;
- B. Acknowledges the past and present harms, including the irrevocable rending of communities and neighborhoods -- especially Black and Indigneous communities -- caused by planning and sustainability policy that forwards white supremacy, through direct accountability to community, community-led work, a Racial Justice Assessment Tool, an annual assessment of the City, and a Racial Equity Strategic Plan that is overseen by community.
- C. Maintains, modifies, and updates a Comprehensive Plan to guide the development and redevelopment of the city through an equity and racial justice lens that dismantles white supremacy;
- B.D. Ensures that City policies, implementation tools, and zoning designations are consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, the Metro Functional Plan, Statewide Planning Goals, and other requirements (as listed in section B), and center racial justice through community-led process and an assessment of present and historical benefits and burdens. Implementation tools include Title 33, Planning and Zoning, portions of other City Titles, a Racial Justice Assessment Tool, developed and updated annually through co-creative process with Black, Indigenous, and other communities of color, and a range of programs and policies;
- C.E. Maintains, modifies, and updates Title 33, Planning and Zoning, and the City Zoning Map;
- F. Develops, modifies and updates, through an environmental, social, economic, and racial justice lens, city sustainability principles, climate protection strategies, and green building and other sustainability policies and programs including sustainable government, renewable energy, energy efficiency, sustainable

industries, and sustainable food systems; and evaluates the implementation and effectiveness of these policies and programs;

**D.G.** Develops, modifies and updates economic, environmental, housing, historic preservation, racial reparations, and community development policies and programs; updates demographic data; advocates for and advances quality safe and sustainable urban design; advocates for and advances racial equity for BIPOC communities; works to ensure natural resource enhancement; and supports thriving neighborhoods and business communities; and evaluates the implementation and effectiveness of these policies and programs using a racial justice and equitable development lens;

**E.H.** Convenes meetings of the Planning and Development Directors to coordinate planning and development activities of the City of Portland;

**F.I.** Provides City input into and coordination with regional and statewide planning and development activities;

**G.L.** Administers the City's solid waste and recycling rules and programs;

**H.K.** Provides support for:

1. The activities of the Planning and Sustainability Commission;
2. The legislative activities of the Portland Historic Landmarks Commission and the Portland Design Commission.
3. The activities of the Community Involvement-Oversight Committee.

**L.** Carries out other tasks and functions as required by the City Council or Commissioner in Charge such that it does not conflict with commitments to racial, social, economic, or environmental justice
