ORDINANCE No. 112427

An Ordinance authorizing the acceptance of a deed for an easement right-of-way for street purposes, a 10-foot strip on the north side of N. W. Hoyt Street, west of N. W. Broadway, authorizing the drawing and delivery of a warrant, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The Council finds that the United States of America, acting by and through the Assistant Postmaster General, Bureau of Facilities, under statutory authority, has executed a deed to the city of Portland for an easement right-of-way for street purposes for the benefit of the public, a 10-foot strip on the north side of N. W. Hoyt Street, west of N. W. Broadway, and adjacent to Blocks T113, 114 and vacated N. W. 8th Avenue and N. W. Park Avenue in Couch's Addition to the city of Portland, and in consideration of payment of \$10.00, and that the said deed should be accepted by the City; now, therefore, the deed of the United States of America, acting by and through the Assistant Postmaster General, Bureau of Facilities, conveying to the City an easement right-of-way for street purposes for the benefit of the public, a 10-foot strip on the north side of N. W. Hoyt Street, west of N. W. Broadway, being a portion of Blocks T113, 114 and vacated N. W. 8th Avenue and N. W. Park Avenue in Couch's Addition, hereby is accepted by the city of Portland, and the Mayor and Auditor are authorized to draw and deliver a warrant in the sum of \$10.00, payable to the Bureau of Finance, Post Office Department, Washington 25, D. C., the said warrant to be drawn against and charged to the General Fund appropriation, Property Widening and Rights-of-way (4650).

Section 2. In order to make funds available for the expenditure authorized in Section 1 hereof, the sum of \$10.00 hereby is transferred from the appropriation Emergency and Unforeseen Expenditures (4100) to the appropriation Property for Widening and Rights-of-Way (4650).

Section 3. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the city of Portland in this: In order that immediate possession of the property may be taken in connection with construction of a new post office facility; therefore, an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council
