

What is the Portland Clean Energy Community Benefits Fund (PCEF)?

- established by a successful ballot measure passed by 65%
 of Portland voters in November 2018
- first-ever environmental measure in Oregon history created and led by communities of color
- \$44-61M in new annual revenue for green jobs and healthy homes with required investments in frontline communities.

How is PCEF funded?

1% surcharge on retailers whose annual sales are over \$1 billion nationally AND over \$500,000 in Portland.

How are funds accessed?






What kinds of projects can be funded?



Clean Energy Programs – Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Programs

Green Infrastructure

- Residential, commercial and school-based projects
- Programs broadening access such as communityinitiated energy strategies and decentralized renewable energy





Workforce & Contractor Development




Green Infrastructure and Regenerative Agriculture




- **Examples of green infrastructure:** urban tree canopy; green roofs; greenspace protection; bioswales; and green streets
- "Regenerative agriculture" means farming and land management practices that reverse climate change by rebuilding soil organic matter and restoring degraded soil biodiversity.

Types of PCEF Grants for year 1



- Other grant types (not included in public comment period):
 - Application support grants up to \$5,000 (Available July 2020)
 - Mini-grants up to \$5,000 (Available 2021)

How are we accountable to meeting PCEF goals?

Targets:

- At least 20% of funding to nonprofits with track record of serving economically disadvantaged community members
- At least 50% of clean energy projects should specifically benefit low-income residents and communities of color.

Requirements:

- Funding agreements must include terms to encourage rent stability
- All projects must have a workforce and contractor equity agreement
- At least 180% of minimum wage to employees on PCEF projects.


Processes:

- Equity-centered Grant Committee
- Commitment to community engagement
- Reporting and continuous improvement.


Grant review process
