

Defining Displacement

Displacement: Households or businesses involuntarily forced to move from a neighborhood because of increasing market values, rents, or changes in the neighborhood's ability to meet basic needs in the case of households, or erosion of traditional client base in the case of businesses.

Existing Anti-Displacement Policy Framework

- Analyze impact, advance equity, mitigate harm
- Leverage private investment for public benefit
- Community empowerment
- Economic opportunity
- Affordable housing and tenant protections
- Environmental justice

- Community led process
- Long-term commitment with resources.
- Build in accountability, transparency, and measurement

PolicyLink Next Steps





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Commit to multi-year funding for A-D coalition

Create a community-led city task force

Identify a permanent source of funding for A-D work

Track and report annually to City Council and the broader community

Anti-Displacement Task Force

- Community-City leadership joint body making recommendations to Council
- Convening in Fall 2020
- Focusing on BIPOC communities
- 15 members, including 5 from city bureau leadership
- Applications open in late-August



- Lived experience of displacement


A-D Task Force Charge

- Develop an agenda for State and Federal support
