ORDINANCE No. 156286

An Ordinance authorizing an agreement with the Oregon Symphony Association in the amount of \$95,000 for the delivery of certain public services, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The City of Portland approved \$63,333 and Multnomah County approved \$31,667 for the Oregon Symphony Association in the 1984-85 Major Institution budget package of the Metropolitan Arts Commission.
2. The Metropolitan Arts Commission has been charged by the City Council and the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners to promote the arts within the City of Portland and Multnomah County.
3. By this contract, the City and County desire to encourage continued success for the Oregon Symphony Association for the benefit of the citizens of Portland and Multnomah County.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs:

- a. The Auditor and Commissioner of Public Safety to execute on behalf of the City a contract similar in form to Exhibit "A" with the Oregon Symphony Association, 813 SW Alder, Portland, Oregon 97205, Attention: John Graham.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor to draw and deliver warrants pursuant to Exhibit "A" for the Oregon Symphony Association, in an amount not to exceed \$ 95,000 to be charged to the Metropolitan Arts Commission (37500046) Miscellaneous Services (260).

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with the contract may unnecessarily deprive the citizens of Multnomah County and the City of Portland of the services being provided; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.

ASSIGNABILITY:

The Contractor shall not assign any interest in this contract and shall not transfer any interest in this contract without prior written consent of the City.

LEGAL PROVISIONS:

1. The Contractor shall make payment promptly as due to persons supplying services for the prosecution of the work provided under this contract.
2. The Contractor shall not permit any lien or claim to be filed or prosecuted against the City on account of labor furnished.
3. The term "Approved by the City" means the written approval of the Commissioner in Charge.
4. All Charter, Code and Statutory provisions applicable to contracts of the City hereby are incorporated and the Contractor shall comply herewith.

6. Provide information and training options: (1) for individuals looking for experience in arts administration, including internships and work study programs; and (2) for young musicians looking for guidance and advice.
7. Provide special opportunities to music students from across the community to attend, free of charge, final rehearsals of classical series concerts.
8. Develop new, more effective educational programs for young people, in cooperation with other arts organizations in the community.
9. Generally enhance the quality of the cultural and musical life in Portland and Multnomah County by providing a wide variety of concerts and musical experiences.

TIME OF PERFORMANCE:

This agreement commences as of the 18th day of July, 1984 and continues through the 30th day of June, 1985.

COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT:

1. Such amounts as may become due to the Contractor by the City because of this contract shall be paid upon receipt by the City of a timely and properly executed requisition and report package as required. All payments are subject to post audit. Total payment shall not exceed \$95,000.
2. Payment Schedule: City shall upon execution of this Agreement pay to the Oregon Symphony Association the sum of Ninety-Five Thousand Dollars (\$95,000).
3. This sum is paid in consideration of the Association's covenant to faithfully perform the above mentioned Contractor obligations.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Contractor shall:

1. Acknowledge the support of the Metropolitan Arts Commission in all printed programs, publicity releases and verbal announcements.
2. Shall cooperate with the evaluation and monitoring by the City and shall furnish a final report to the Metropolitan Arts Commission at the end of the contract period. This report shall delineate how the Contractor has accomplished each of the nine elements of Contractor performance.

TERMINATION:

This contract may be cancelled by the City for any willful failure or refusal on the part of the Contractor to perform faithfully the contract according to its terms.

RECITALS:

1. The City of Portland approved \$63,333 and Multnomah County approved \$31,667 for the Oregon Symphony Association in the 1984-85 Major Institution budget package of the Metropolitan Arts Commission.
2. The Metropolitan Arts Commission has been charged by the City Council and the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners to promote the arts within the City of Portland and Multnomah County.
3. By this contract, the City and County desire to encourage continued success for the Oregon Symphony Association for the benefit of the citizens of Portland and Multnomah County.

AGREED:

CONTRACTOR SHALL:

1. Provide matching monies from new sources or increased monies from existing sources to equal the \$95,000 provided for in this contract.
2. Provide one series of educational concerts in Portland Civic Auditorium, for elementary, junior and senior high school students, at a nominal fee, number of concerts to total 16.
3. Provide low-cost student and senior citizen discount tickets for a classical series.
4. Provide 5 low-cost Sunday afternoon family concert performances in the Portland Civic Auditorium, encouraging families, senior citizens and students to participate in these popular classical programs, at special nominal prices to senior citizens and students.
5. Make available to schools, civic groups and other organizations lectures and demonstrations on various aspects of music and the symphony business.
