

Historic Resource Inventory Rank I, II, III Resources

Historic Resource Inventory
Unranked Resources

- Previous Goal 5 Rule allowed Portland to automatically identify National Register listings as Historic Landmarks/Districts
- 2017 Goal 5 Rule provides statewide baseline for automatic protection of National Register listings (effective to January 2017)
- 2016 State Supreme Court decision and 2017 Goal 5 Rule confirm that resources can be inventoried and determined significant without owner consent.
- 2017 Goal 5 Rule specifies that local Landmark and District designation requires at least 50%+1 owner consent

Less protections

More protections





1904 Otto and Verdell Rutherford House

- Listed on National Register August 2015
- Automatically "identified" as a Historic Landmark on Zoning Map
- Subject to Historic Landmark regulations (demolition review + historic resource review)



1926 Billy Webb Elks Lodge

- Listed on National Register July 2020
- Automatically subject to Goal 5 regulations (demolition review)
- Applying additional regulations requires a land use decision (local designation)
