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*When an acceptance is required from a firm or corporation the Acceptance must be signed by an officer of the firm or corporation stating his or her official title, and corporations must affix the corporate seal. An Ordinance vacating all that portion of N. Kilpatrick Street lying between the east line of N. Kerby Avenue and a line drawn 10.5 feet west of and parallel with the west line of N. Congress Avenue, under certain conditions.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- Skolfield Fuel Company, on July 25, 1979 filed a petition to vacate all that portion of N. Kilpatrick Street lying between the east line of N. Kerby Avenue and the west line of N. Congress Avenue.
- 2. The petition states the reason for the vacation is to acquire ownership of unimproved street area.
- 3. In order to retain sufficient right of way to allow the improvement of the remaining portion of the turnaround at the intersection of N. Kilpatrick Street and N. Congress Avenue, only the vacation of all that portion of N. Kilpatrick Street lying between the east line of N. Kerby Avenue and a line drawn 10.5 feet west of and parallel with the west line of N. Congress Avenue is recommended by the Commissioner of Public Works under certain conditions set forth in the directive action below.
- 4. In accordance with O.R.S. 271.100, the Council fixed a time and place for public hearing before the Council; the Auditor published notice thereof; and posted notice in the area proposed to be vacated.
- 5. Other procedural requirements of O.R.S. 271 have been complied with and the Council having held a public hearing finds no objections were made or filed hereto and it is in the public interest that said street be vacated.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. All that portion of N. Kilpatrick Street lying between the east line of N. Kerby Avenue and a line drawn 10.5 feet west of and parallel with the west line of N. Congress Avenue, is hereby vacated.
- b. The vacation of the above described street area is granted subject to the following conditions and restrictions:

- That the petitioner pay to the City the sum of \$215.00, this being the cost of the vacation proceedings in excess of the minimum filing fee of \$200.00 already paid.
- (2) Nothing contained herein shall cause or require the removal or abandonment of any sewer or gas main, conduit of any kind, wire, pole or thing used, or intended to be used for any public service, and the right hereby is reserved for the owner of any such utility or thing to maintain, continue, repair, reconstruct, renew, replace, rebuild, and/or enlarge any and all such things; that no building or structure of any kind shall be built or erected within a distance of ten feet from the centerline of any such utility, except with the prior written consent of the City Engineer and the owner of the utility and that any and all contemplated building plans in said vacated area shall be submitted for approval to the City Engineer and to the Director of the Bureau of Buildings, to the end that such construction may be so adjusted with reference to all public utilities in said area as to cause a minimum of danger or inconvenience to the public and to the owner of such utility and to protect and preserve the same as presently constructed or hereinafter reconstructed, renewed, replaced and/or enlarged.
- (3) That the petitioner agrees to pay all costs of intersection reconstruction at the intersection of N. Kilpatrick Street and N. Congress Avenue as required by the City Engineer and in accordance with plans to be furnished by the City Engineer.
- The sum of \$1581.00 in cash be deposited by the petitioner (4) with the City Treasurer in a trust fund, or a corporate surety bond in the above amount and approved by the City be posted in lieu thereof, to cover the estimated cost of improvements required by the City Engineer. Upon completion of the work by and at the expense of the petitioners, and in accordance with plans furnished by the City Engineer, said sum of \$1581.00 will be refunded or the surety bond will be released. In the event the cash deposit or bond is not sufficient to cover the costs of reconstruction as required by the City Engineer, the petitioners agree to pay all costs in excess of such deposit or bond, and the petitioners further agree that if they fail or neglect to complete said reconstruction within a reasonable time, as determined by the City Engineer, the City is authorized to draw from the sum deposited, or on the bond, as is required to complete the reconstruction by City Maintenance personnel.

ORDINANCE No.

That in the event the petitioner fails to fully comply (5) with the above conditions within six months after the effective date of the vacating ordinance, said ordinance will then be subject to repeal by the Council.

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
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- Petitioner shall file with the Auditor a document, which has a. been approved by the City Attorney, accepting the terms and conditions hereof.
- The City Auditor shall, at the expense of the petitioner, Ь. file with the recorder, the assessor, the surveyor of the county in which said property is located, a certified copy of this ordinance and the acceptance thereof, and any map, plat or other record which may be required by law.

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
