**QUALIFYING FEEDSTOCK ORIGIN DECLARATION**

The Bureau of Development Services (BDS) is responsible for the study and monitoring of biodiesel production, use and sales in the City of Portland. The Bureau will use the information collected from this form and other required documentation, identified in item 5 below, to verify that the qualifying feedstock requirements have been met under Portland’s Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) and PCC16.60.020: when selling or dispensing biodiesel to the Portland market, 50% by volume of the biodiesel must be produced from qualifying feedstock.<sup>1</sup>

Reporting will occur on a quarterly basis for each calendar year. Reports are to be submitted quarterly. BDS will determine compliance through annual compilation of information submitted in quarterly reports, which will occur after the close of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.

<sup>1</sup> Qualifying Feedstock means feedstock (the plant or animal matter from which a biofuel is derived) from Brassica (Canola), Camelina (Flax), Helianthus (Sunflower), Carthamus (Safflower), and used cooking oil.

Qualifying feedstock requirements will be considered to have been met if the amount of biodiesel from qualifying feedstocks delivered to a Bulk Facility or Marketer meets or exceeds 50% of the biodiesel distributed to City of Portland fuel vendors.

<sup>2</sup> "Bulk Facility" means a facility, including pipeline terminals, refinery terminals, rail and barge terminals, and associated underground and above ground tanks, connected or separate, from which motor vehicle fuels are withdrawn from bulk and delivered to retail, wholesale or non-retail facilities or into a cargo tank or barge used to transport products used to comply with PCC Chapter 16.60.

<sup>3</sup> "Marketer" means any person engaged in the business of distributing or reselling fuel to a Fuel Vendor, including wholesale dealers and fuel distributors, used to comply with the requirements of PCC Chapter 16.60. If a Bulk Facility is filing this report based upon a contractual arrangement with a Marketer, please provide information both on the Bulk Facility and the Marketer named above.

<sup>4</sup> "Bulk Facility" means a facility, including pipeline terminals, refinery terminals, rail and barge terminals, and associated underground and above ground tanks, connected or separate, from which motor vehicle fuels are withdrawn from bulk and delivered to retail, wholesale or non-retail facilities or into a cargo tank or barge used to transport products used to comply with PCC Chapter 16.60.

<sup>5</sup> To be submitted by a Bulk Facility and a Marketer other than a Marketer which shall be deemed to have met the minimum qualifying feedstock requirement if each Bulk Facility the Marketer has contractual arrangements with to supply the Portland Market meets the requirements of PCC 16.60.020
