

ORDINANCE NO. 149310

An Ordinance authorizing the transfer of \$170,950 within the General Fund to Transfers to Other Funds - Electronic Services and increasing the appropriation of the Bureau of Electronic Services by \$197,950 to procure equipment and provide the necessary technical and engineering services associated with an EMS dispatch system, and declaring an emergency.

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. Implementation of a proposed Emergency Medical Services dispatch system requires acquisition of new communications equipment;
2. Funds were appropriated in the 1978-79 Electronic Services Budget for the purchase of necessary equipment;
3. System requirements were not sufficiently defined to permit equipment acquisition during 1978-79;
4. A plan has been established and preliminary design engineering has produced a list of communications equipment necessary to support ambulance dispatching;
5. It is appropriate that adequate funds be available before the Bureau of Electronic Services initiates the bid process to procure equipment;
6. Funds and appropriations should be transferred to allow the Bureau of Electronic Services to procure equipment and to provide the necessary technical and engineering services associated with design, acquisition, installation, and evaluation of an EMS dispatch system.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The 1979-80 Budget is amended as follows:
