Ms. Hansen,

Thank you for forwarding the complaint dated July 27, 2020. Our initial question is why we are being brought this complaint and a request to respond when we are not the object of the complaint, but rather, "The Committee to Elect Loretta Smith" is the object of the complaint. In any event, we will still address the complaint in whatever way it seems to relate to us and our organization.

As this complaint itself clearly states referencing Portland City Charter Section 3-304: "A candidate participating in a government system of public funding of campaigns (including the Public Election Fund established under Portland City Code Chapter 2.16) may receive any amount that such system allows a participating candidate to receive." ; And as your office has also previously held in their decisions on July 9th (See, City Candidate: Mingus Mapps, 2020-17-MM, determination (<u>https://www.portlandoregon.gov/auditor/article/763682</u>); "Candidates may also voluntarily participate in public campaign funding through the OAE Program and participating candidate to receive." PCC 2.10.040.", we do not understand what about our June 25th in-kind contribution was in violation of any section of the Portland Charter, or any relevant campaign finance laws, as it was an allowed contribution under Open and Accountable elections and Portland Charter Section 3-304.

As was the findings of the Open and Accountable elections department, the in-kind contribution from "Local 48 Electricians PAC" in the amount of \$9,111.95 was erroneously entered by the treasurer of the Committee to Elect Loretta Smith as having come in at June 10th, and was properly corrected within the OAE cure period to reflect that the in-kind contribution was in fact received on May, 07, 2020, (See SOS reporting information <u>https://secure.sos.state.or.us/orestar/gotoPublicTransactionDetail.do?tranRsn=3519171&OWASP\_CSRFTOKEN=WI4F-38JA-DL85-GSPO-JY2S-AFG0-BELA-6XRH</u>)

As such, and as determined by the Open and Accountable Elections division, there was no violation of their program, and as our June 25th In-kind contribution is clearly in an "amount that such system allows a participating candidate to receive", it does not come under the scrutiny of any other campaign finance limitations.

As your office has previously determined in the Mingus decision, since these amounts do not violate the OAE guidelines, and the candidate retains their status of a participating candidate in the OAE program, no violation of City Campaign Finance Regulations can be found, when "the candidate has only received contribution amounts permitted by the OAE Program." For the above reasons it is our position that as our June 25th in-kind contribution has been determined to be "an amount permitted by the OAE Program", it is thus not a violation.

Thank you for your response, it still does not answer my question as to what the specific violation is that is outside of the OAE carve out within Portland Charter Section 3-304. Nor does it answer why we are being called to respond to this complaint as this complaint was filed against The Committee to Elect Loretta Smith, and no complaint was filed against UFCW Local 555, thus we are not the object of the complaint? I will submit a more formal response and get it to you before the deadline in order to preserve all arguments for litigation.

However, any clarity you could provide as to why we are even being called to do so would help us understand what we need to do vis-a-vi our appellate rights, or whatever injunctive relief we may need to call upon from the courts as this moves forward.

In short, Open and Accountable Elections (OAE) and Honest Elections are related, albeit separate, programs governed by separate provisions of City charter and code. In this particular case, a complaint that was received raised questions under both programs. Therefore, OAE made a determination with regards to whether there was a violation under its program, and the City Elections Office is now in the process of investigating and making a determination as to whether there are any violations under the provisions governed by the City Elections Office. In short, the response requested pertains specifically to the allegations as they relate to overall City Campaign finance regulations, regardless of whether a candidate has participated in the separate Open and Accountable Elections program.
