It looks like the website at: <https://tedwheeler.com/news> recently underwent a redesign.

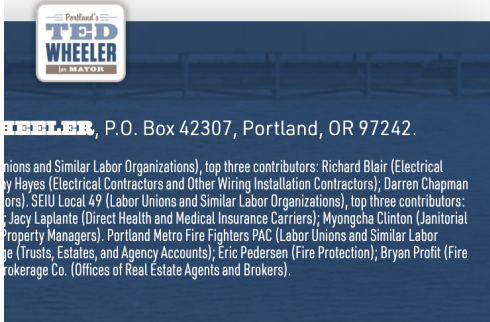


I commend the campaign for updating the design to present the disclosure text in a contrasting color (according to WCAG standards), but, unfortunately it chose a font that is smaller than the majority of the text on the page in violation of the Charter and Code.

In the current configuration, the font for the article teasers (CSS: "div.entry-summary") is rendered in a current Chrome browser at 14px with a line height of 23.1px in the font family "urw-din, sans serif"

In contrast, the disclaimer text (CSS "div.contributors") renders in the same browser at 12.5px with 13.75px line height in the font family "urw-din-condensed, sans-serif".

The font used for the disclaimer is a "condensed" version of the original font, and it is also in a nominally smaller font size. Additionally, it is compacted into tighter vertical space. The entire effect results in a much smaller effective font size for the disclaimer than the body text.

In order to show the stark difference between the disclaimer text and the majority of the text on the page, here is what the page looks like currently compared to what it would look like if the disclaimer text received the same styling treatment as the article summary elements.

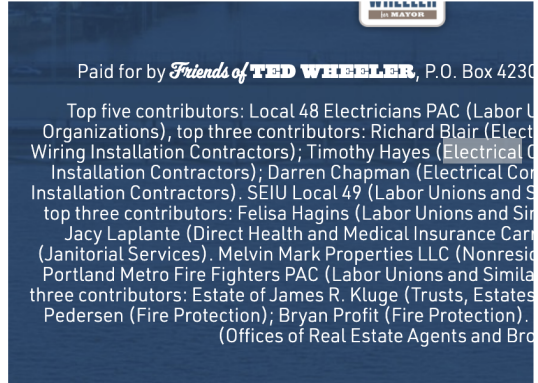
Unmodified web page on Aug. 5, 2020
