Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Background and Goals

Program Background:

 Responds to community needs identified in N/NE Neighborhood Housing Strategy, through community engagement and advocacy by N/NE Oversight Committee.

Program Goals:

• Stem the continued displacement of longtime homeowners and prevent additional loss of housing wealth in the N/NE community.



Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Providers and Timeline

- Total Funding from Portland Housing Bureau: \$200,000 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding
- Contract awarded to African American Alliance for Homeownership (AAAH) in partnership with The Commons Law Center



• 20-Month Pilot Program (November 2019 – June 2021)

Program Development Phase – November 2019 – January 2020

Service Delivery Phase – February 2020 – June 2021

Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Services and Eligibility

Services: Homeowner retention and legal estate planning services

Eligibility:

- Households earning up to 80% Area Median Income (AMI) or \$73,700 for a family of four
- Homeowner residing in Interstate Urban Renewal Area or the N/NE Study Area

Target Services to:

- Homeowners of Color
- Longtime homeowners (20+ years)
- Seniors and people with disabilities

Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Program Staffing



AAAH Program Staff: As the lead organization, AAAH is the first point of contact for homeowners interested in Estate Planning. Etta Baker, Program Manager works with individuals to assess their program eligibility, address other homeowner retention needs, and to provide on-going support throughout their program participation.

- Estate Planning Educational Workshops
- Wills, Revocable Trusts, and Living Trusts
- Probate and Estate Administration
- Real Estate Title Transfers
- Power of Attorney



Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Accomplishments


February – December 2020

• Seven estate planning educational webinars provided (surpassing goal of two workshops)

56 webinar attendees
(surpassing goal of 40 attendees)

• 21 program participants enrolled (47% toward meeting goal of 45)

Homeownership Asset Preservation Pilot: Next Steps

Leveraging Additional Funding:

• The Commons Law Center received a foundation grant to specifically hire an additional law school graduate of color to support the pilot program.

Pilot Program Extension:

• Due to COVID-19 NHP recommends a 6-month extension of the pilot until December 31, 2021.

Pilot Program Progress Report:

• A pilot program progress report will be presented to the N/NE Oversight Committee in July 2021 to discuss the future of the program beyond the pilot.
